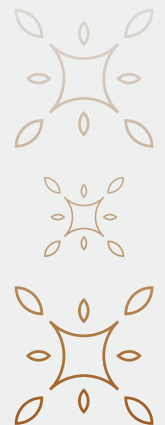

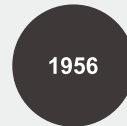
## THE CROSS ENCLOSED BY ALPHA OMEGA

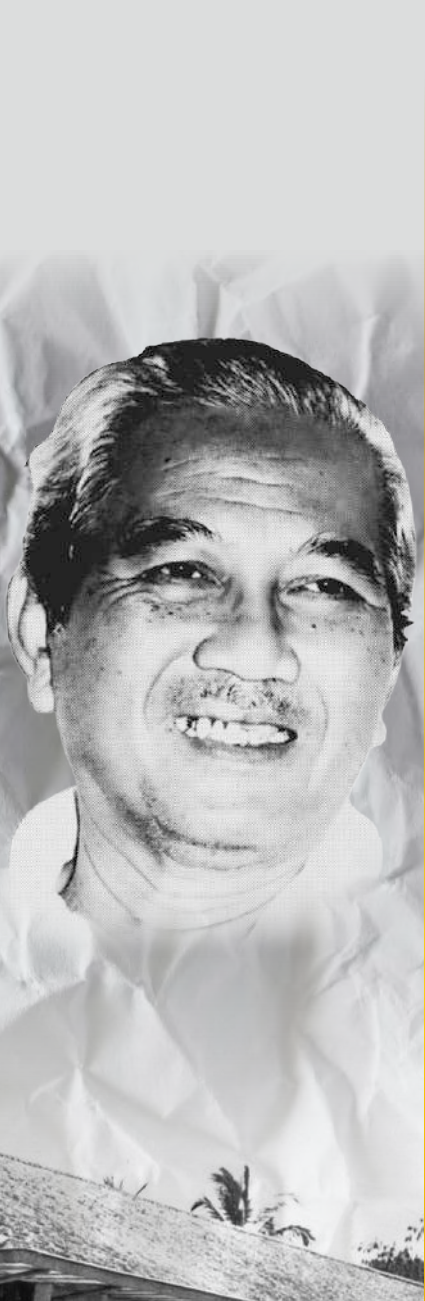
## DR. (H.C.) OERIPAN NOTOHAMIDJOJO, S.H.

Born in Blora in 1915, Dr. Oeripan Notohamidjojo came from a family of prominent figures in religious law and the Islamic movement. Growing up in an environment deeply rooted in governance and spiritual values, he developed a distinctive combination of legal expertise, leadership ability, and intellectual interest in theology and Dooyeweerd's philosophy.

For Dr. Notohamidjojo, leadership was not merely a matter of innate talent but the result of education, formation, and opportunity. He believed that every individual possesses the potential to become a leader when given the proper space to learn and grow. In his view, leadership carries two fundamental responsibilities: first, to the organization one leads—by serving a shared purpose; and second, to the people one leads—by setting an example through integrity, attitude, and action.

He also emphasized the importance of spiritual competence in leadership, grounded in reverence for God. This conviction is reflected in the philosophical foundation of Satya Wacana Christian University (SWCU), which he led, where Soevereiniteit (Sovereignty) serves as a core value. For Dr. Notohamidjojo, true academics are those who honor God and embody religious and Pancasila values—not merely as symbols, but as enduring sources of national and humanitarian spirit within the sphere of education.





# SWCU FIGURES

## DS. BASOEKI PROBOWINOTO

Ds. Basuki Probowinoto (January 19, 1917 – January 6, 1989) was a pivotal figure in Indonesian history. As a pastor of the Javanese Christian Church (Gereja Kristen Jawa, GKJ), founder of the Indonesian Christian Party (Partai Kristen Indonesia, PARKINDO), and founder of Satya Wacana Christian University (Universitas Kristen Satya Wacana, UKSW), he was widely recognized as a visionary leader devoted to the advancement of both the nation and the Christian faith.

From an early age, Probowinoto demonstrated remarkable intelligence and a strong desire for learning. After completing his teacher training, he pursued theological studies and later served as a pastor in Purwodadi and Kwitang, Jakarta—contexts that exposed him to complex social and spiritual challenges.

Probowinoto's contributions extended far beyond the religious sphere. In the political arena, he emerged as a courageous Christian intellectual marked by integrity and conviction. He mobilized Christian leaders to take part in Indonesia's struggle for independence. During the Japanese occupation, he maintained communication with the occupying authorities, advocating for justice by reporting acts of discrimination against local communities and articulating the Christian perspective with honesty and balance.

With wisdom and courage, Probowinoto called upon Christians to stand in solidarity with the Republic, supporting the independence movement despite facing pressure and accusations of siding with the Dutch. His steadfastness and moral clarity exemplify how faith, intellect, and courage can unite in the pursuit of national freedom and humanity.

The letter "O" incorporates the official UKSW emblem, signifying the university's distinct identity. 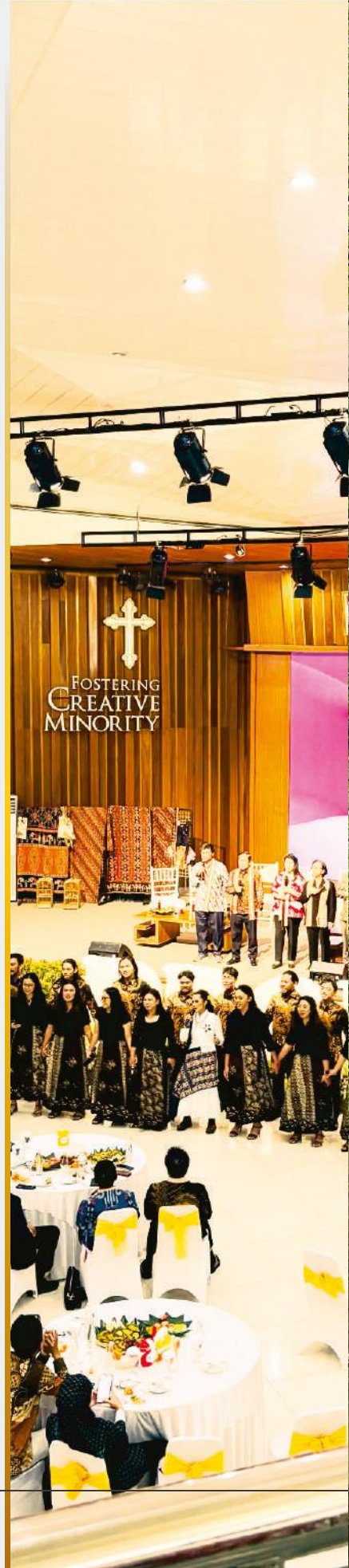
The inscription "SWCU" is rendered in bold to represent the university's strong and reputable foundation. In contrast, the word "mini" is written in an ancient script, signifying the rich heritage of diversity that continues to be cherished and preserved at UKSW.

# 502 Competent Lecturers

Satya Wacana Christian University (SWCU) currently employs 502 lecturers who actively contribute to the Tri Dharma of Higher Education (education, research, and community services). Among them, 74 lecturers have not yet attained functional academic positions, while the rest serve in various roles, including Asisten Ahli (117), Lektor (209), Lektor Kepala (71), and Professors (31).

The university's academic excellence is further reflected in the diverse educational backgrounds of its faculty members. A majority of 383 lecturers completed their studies in Indonesia, while others earned their degrees from leading universities abroad, including those in the United States, Australia, the Netherlands, Belgium, Estonia, the Philippines, the United Kingdom, Japan, Germany, South Korea, Malaysia, France, Spain, Taiwan, and Thailand.

This blend of domestic and international academic experience fosters a dynamic and globally informed academic environment, enriching the university's scientific and intellectual climate.

6. Providing LPM services that are Professional, Competent, Responsive, Ethical, Accountable, Transparent, and Informative (PROKREATIF).

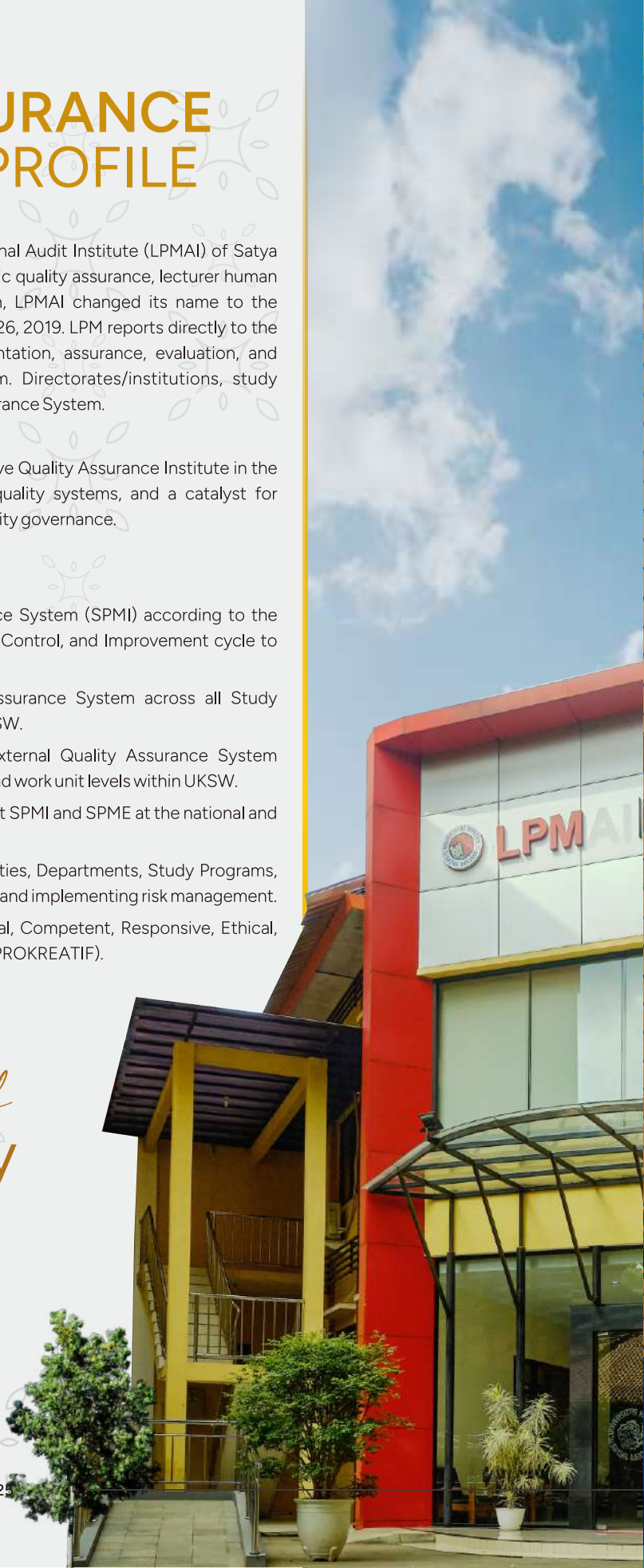

## CREATING A SAFE AND HUMANE CAMPUS WITH THE PPKPT TASK FORCE AT UKSW

Satya Wacana Christian University (UKSW) continues to strengthen its commitment to creating a learning environment that is safe, respectful, and free from all forms of violence. Realizing this condition through the establishment of the Task Force for the Prevention and Handling of Violence in Higher Education (PPKPT)—a vital initiative that ensures every member of the university community, including students, lecturers, and staff, can learn, work, and interact in an atmosphere of dignity and mutual respect.

The PPKPT Task Force serves not only as an administrative body but also as a moral movement that upholds justice, empathy, and human rights on campus. Its responsibilities cover both prevention and response to various forms of violence, including physical, psychological, and sexual violence; bullying; discrimination; and intolerance. The task force offers a safe and supportive environment for individuals seeking counseling, education, or guidance on building ethical and respectful relationships within the academic setting. It was previously known as the Task Force for the Prevention and Handling of Sexual Violence (PPKS) but has evolved to recognize that violence in higher education extends beyond sexual misconduct.



Under Ministerial Regulation of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology (Permendikbudristek) No. 55 of 2024, the government has expanded the PPKS mandate into PPKPT, introducing five major updates:

1. The scope of violence now includes six categories.
2. Formation procedures have been adjusted to fit institutional capacities.
3. The duties of the task force now encompass education, research, and community service.
4. Referral mechanisms are clearly defined, even for incidents that occur off-campus.
5. Institutions are required to allocate specific funding for prevention and response initiatives.

Violence, whether physical or digital, has a profound impact on an individual's well-being, confidence, and academic success. UKSW therefore calls on its community to unite under the message: "Stop Violence, Break the Silence." Reporting incidents is an act of courage and integrity.

Each report submitted to the UKSW PPKPT Task Force is handled with professionalism, confidentiality, and compassion, ensuring that healing and justice remain the university's top priorities. 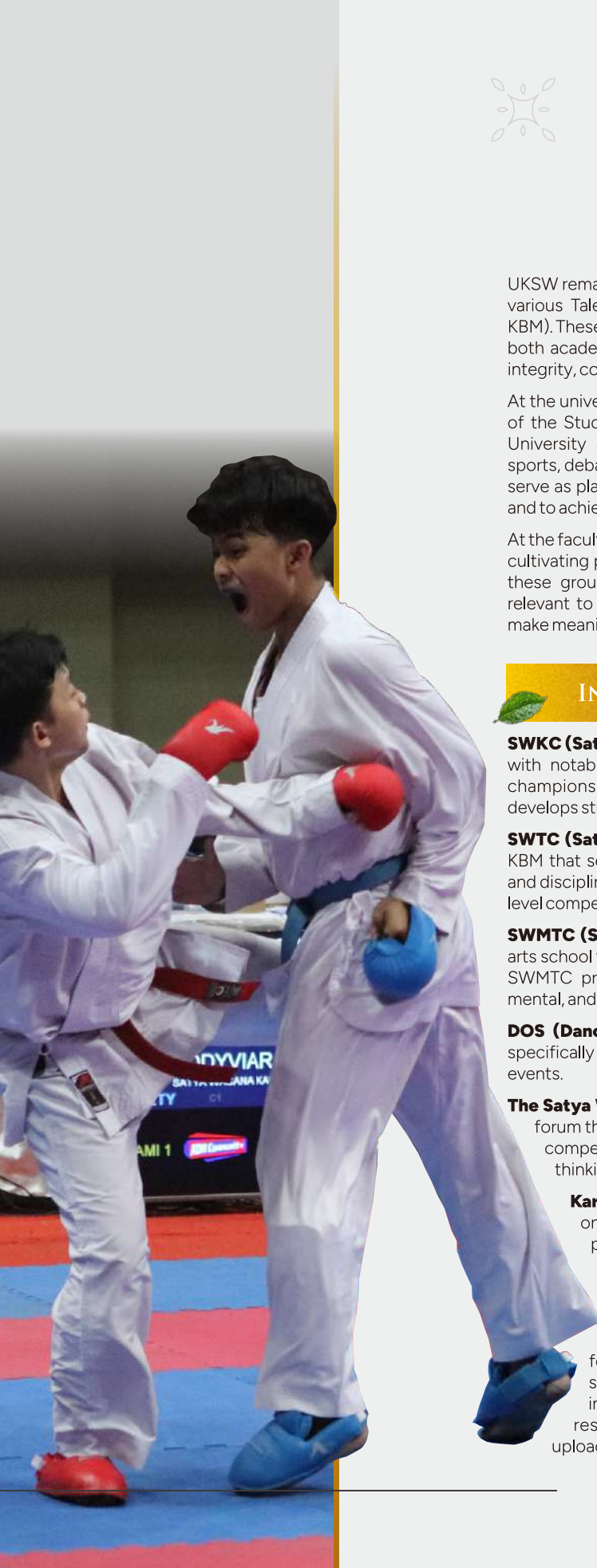

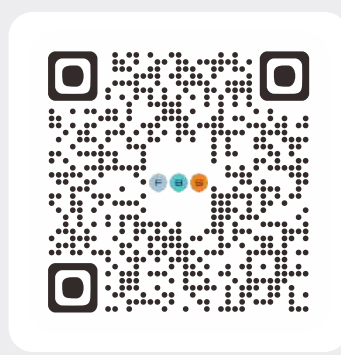


## Overview

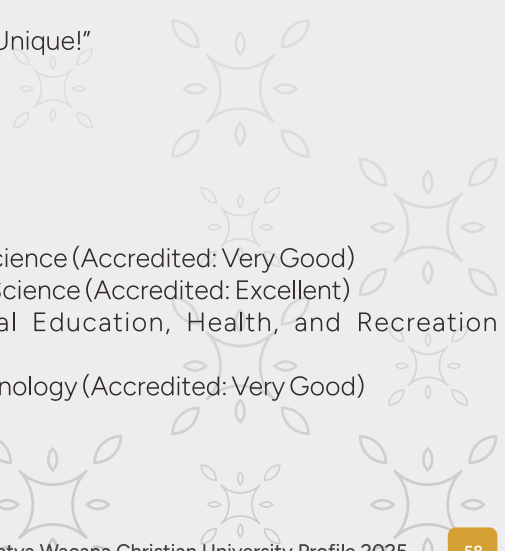


## Overview

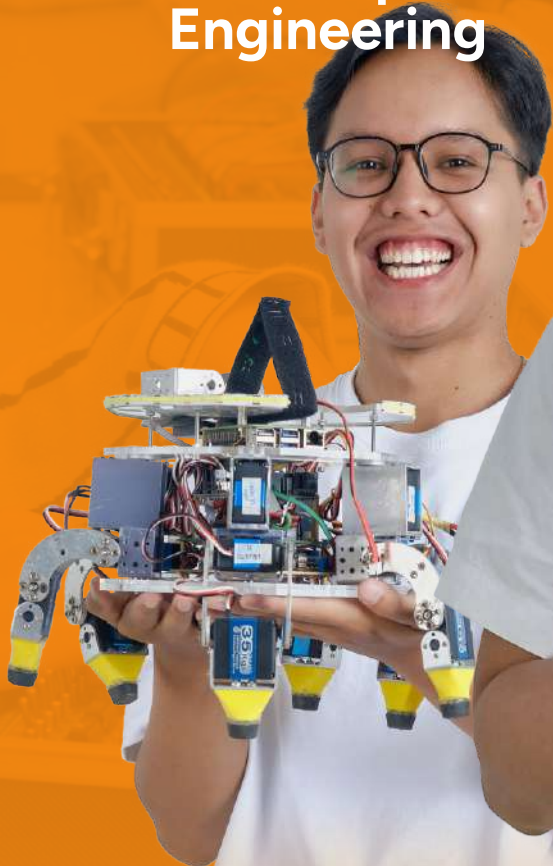

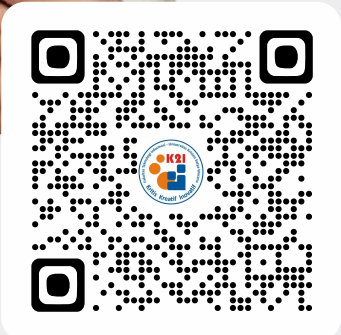

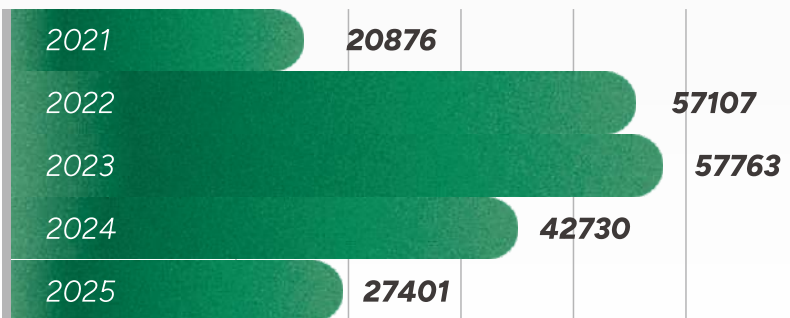

# SWCU MUSEUM

The SWCU Museum is a dedicated institution inaugurated on December 10, 2024, by the Rector of SWCU, Prof. Intiyas Utami, and marked by a ribbon-cutting ceremony led by Prof. Dr. Thomas Suyatno, Chairman of the Association of Indonesian Private Higher Education Institutions (ABP PTSI). The inauguration coincided with SWCU's 68th anniversary.

The museum chronicles SWCU's long journey as a "Mini Indonesian Campus," reflecting the diversity, unity, and spirit of cross-cultural tolerance within the SWCU academic community. It was designed by Anthony Y. M. Tumimomor, S.Kom., M.Cs., a lecturer in Visual Communication Design at the Faculty of Information Technology, with the concept of a "growing museum," symbolizing the university's continuous pursuit of knowledge, adaptability, innovation, and its commitment to making a positive impact on society, the nation, and the state.

The SWCU Museum exhibits 90% original SWCU artifacts, comprising hundreds of physical objects, rare books from various countries, literary manuscripts, photographic documentation, and audiovisual materials. Among the featured collections are artifacts belonging to Dr. O. Notohamidjojo, SWCU's first rector, including a court gavel, work diary, pen, hand-cranked telephone, and other personal items. Through the digitization of approximately 20,000 photographic archives, the museum also functions as a center for historical preservation and academic learning for the entire SWCU community.

Located on the second floor of the SWCU Central Library, the museum serves as a "House of History"—a source of inspiration, a center for literacy and education, and a bridge connecting the academic community with the broader public. It also reinforces the historical relationship between SWCU and the city of Salatiga, which have grown together in harmony. The museum stands as an ideal place for anyone seeking to understand the rich and enduring history of the SWCU campus.

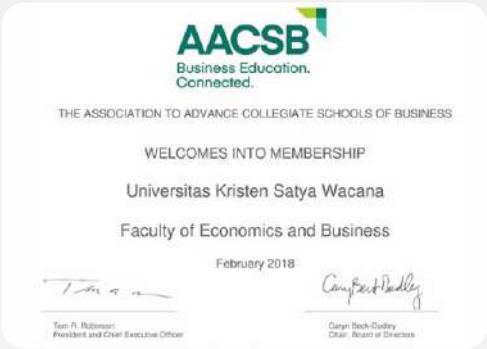

Gelar Inovasi Harmoni Nusantara is an annual event organized by Satya Wacana Christian University (SWCU) that showcases innovative works and creative solutions from students, lecturers, and industry partners. ## SWCU ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS (EASE AND GLOBEES)

Satya Wacana Christian University (SWCU) organizes two annual international programs — the East Asia Student Encounter (EASE) and the Global Education Experiences (GlobEEs) — as platforms for cultural and language exchange among international students.

EASE, a collaboration between SWCU and Kwansai Gakuin University (KGU), Japan, has been conducted since 1977. 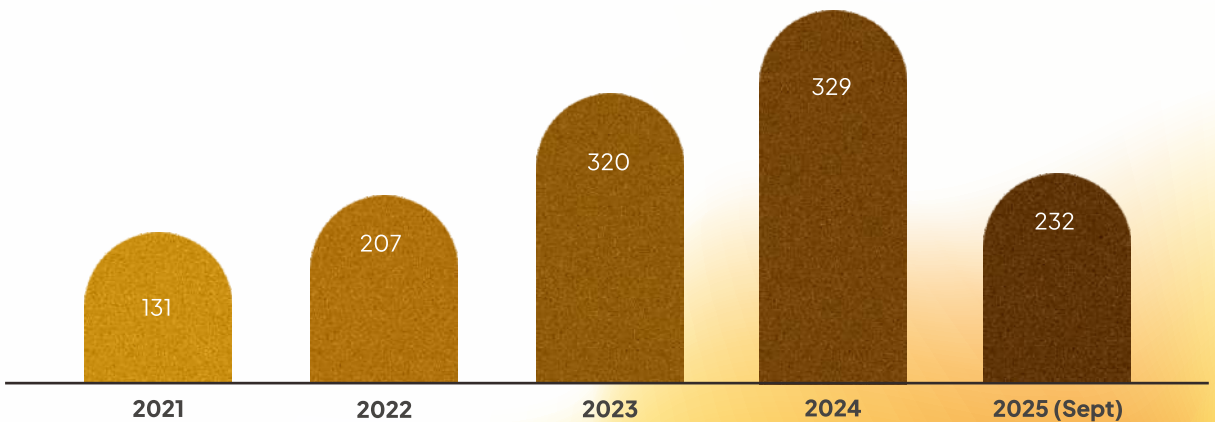
