

Bishop Charles Harrison Mason

Founder, Senior Bishop and First Apostle

Bishop Charles Harrison Mason

Bishop Charles Harrison Mason was the founder and first Senior Bishop of the Church of God in Christ (COGIC), presently the largest African-American Pentecostal church in the United States.

Born to former slaves Jerry and Eliza Mason in Shelby County, Tenn., on Sept. 8, 1864, Mason worked with his family as a sharecropper and did not receive a formal education as a child. But at an early age, he was influenced by his parents' religion.

Mason joined the African-American Missionary Baptist Church when he was an adolescent and later received his license to preach from the Mount Gale Missionary Baptist Church in Preston, Ark. In November 1893, Mason enrolled at the Arkansas Baptist College, but withdrew after three months to transfer to the Minister's Institute at the College. He graduated from the Institute in 1895.

In 1895, Mason met Charles Price Jones, a popular Baptist preacher from Mississippi. Mason and Jones soon began preaching the doctrine of holiness and sanctification in the local Baptist churches, which led to their expulsion from the Baptist Convention.

Mason and Jones decided to form a new fellowship of churches. Mason suggested the name Church of God In Christ, after what he described as a vision in Little Rock, Ark., to distinguish the church from a number of "Church of God" groups forming at that time.


Due to disagreements in the new Pentecostal teachings, the two men split their group in 1907. Mason won the legal rights to the Church of God in Christ name and charter, and established his work in Memphis.

After moving the COGIC headquarters to Memphis, Mason established additional departments and auxiliaries, created dioceses, and appointed overseers throughout the country.

In 1945, Mason dedicated Mason Temple in Memphis as the church's national meeting site and the international headquarters of the Church of God in Christ.

At the time of Mason's death on November 17, 1961, COGIC had a membership of more than 400,000 and more than 4,000 churches in the United States as well as congregations in Europe, South America, Africa, and Asia.

Today, it has an estimated 6.5 million members. The church can be found in every state in the United States and in more than 100 countries around the world.



Bishop J. Drew Sheard

Bishop John Drew Sheard was born on January 1, 1959, in Detroit, Michigan, to the late Bishop John Henry Sheard and Mother Willie Mae Sheard. He was saved at a young age under the pastorate of the late Bishop John Seth Bailey and later acknowledged his call to the Ministry.

He obtained a Bachelor of Science degree in Education and a Master of Education in Mathematics from Wayne State University. In 1988 he began his pastoral Ministry at Greater Emmanuel Church. Shortly afterward, the church grew exponentially, and in May of 1992, the faithful purchased a beautiful edifice located at 16776 Southfield Road. Then, Pastor Sheard renamed the church, adding "institutional," signifying Greater Emmanuel's purpose of organizing and uniting for a particular purpose – to lead souls to Christ.

His innovative and non-traditional approaches to Ministry appeal to many and distinguish him as a ministry trailblazer. He instituted specialized ministry worship experiences such as "Holy Women in Red," "Sanctified Men in Black," and an annual leadership recognition luncheon, to name a few. His ideas propelled him to the forefront of the civic and religious community and gained him recognition as a "bridge builder" to other denominations. In 1996, Bishop Herbert J. Williams, Sr., Establishmentarian and Prelate of the Michigan North Central Jurisdiction, appointed him Superintendent of the Emmanuel District.

Bishop Sheard has worked diligently in several positions in the church, locally and nationally, and in various civic capacities, including International Youth Department President for the Church of God in Christ, Vice-Chairman of the Church of God in Christ, Inc.'s Auxiliaries In Ministries (AIM) convention, and Chairman of the Auxiliaries In Ministries (AIM) convention.

In March 1999, Bishop Sheard moved the congregation to temporary housing in Detroit until a larger edifice became available. And in March of 2002, Greater Emmanuel Institutional Church of God in Christ moved into its present facility at 19190 Schaefer Highway.

Bishop Sheard received an honorary Doctorate of Divinity degree in 2004 and, in 2007, was inducted into the prestigious Morehouse College Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers. Later, he and his wife, Lady Karen Clark-Sheard, founded Karew Records, a faith-based record label focusing on various forms of Gospel, Christian, and Inspirational music.

In January 2010, Bishop Herbert J. Williams, Sr., announced his plan to answer the call of God to "step aside and let the young man pass" after nearly 35 years as prelate. Based on Bishop Williams's recommendation and the support of a majority of the Pastors of the Jurisdiction, Bishop Sheard was elevated to the Office of Jurisdictional Bishop. Then, in 2012 he was elected to the Presidium, the General Board of the Church of God in Christ, Inc. In his November 2016 reelection bid to the General Board, he was re-elected as the second-highest vote-getter. In 2021, the delegates of the General Assembly re-elected Bishop Sheard as a member of the Presidium of the Church of God in Christ, Inc., and subsequently elected him to the Office of the Presiding Bishop as Chief Apostle, the leader of the worldwide organization.

He has been instrumental in guaranteeing humanitarian aid to Pastors affected by natural disasters, has donated thousands to recent relief efforts in Jackson, Mississippi. and led an ecumenical effort to raise over \$100,000 to support Pastors and ministry leaders during COVID-19.

Currently, he is a Member of the Housing and Community Development Corporation in Wayne County, Michigan; The Detroit Medical Center Ministerial Advisory Council, the Executive Committee of the Urban Alliance of Michigan (UAM), and the Governor's Religious Advisory Board.

Bishop Sheard and Lady Karen Clark Sheard have two children, Kierra Sheard Kelly and John Drew Sheard, II; one son-in-love, Jordan Kelly; and two grandchildren, Jacob and Kali Drew.

Bishop Sheard's accomplishments, coupled with his abundant love and unfeigned devotion to God and the church, instill within those who follow him the confidence that he is a leader capable of taking them to the next level of Ministry.





EPISTLE FROM OUR LEADER



- Identifying any gaps in the health service delivery system that particularly affect minorities;
- Making recommendations to relevant agencies and to the legislature for improving the delivery and access to health services for minorities; and
- Studying and making recommendations as to whether adequate services are available to ensure future minority health needs will be met.

VISION

The AMHC's vision is that minority Arkansans have equal opportunity and access to health, health care and preventive well care

GOAL

Our goal is to be a catalyst in bridging the gap in the health status of the minority population and that of the majority population in Arkansas. To accomplish this, the commission focuses on addressing existing disparities in minority communities, educating these communities on healthier lifestyles, promoting awareness of services and accessibility within our health care system, and making recommendations to relevant agencies, the Governor and to the state legislature.
