
















DEAN OF THE FACULTY OF PODIATRIC SURGERY

Becoming a podiatric surgeon begins by gaining experience working as a podiatrist alongside developing your interest in podiatric surgery by reading, networking and obtaining membership support by joining your local Royal College of Podiatry Regional Deanery group.



The Royal College of Podiatry is the premier podiatry organisation in the United Kingdom. It is a learned society, incorporated on 17 November 1945, and an independent trade union affiliated to the TUC. 


