

During the months of January – April, dis-/embarkation in Cambodia for sailings aboard Heritage Line Jayavarman takes place at Kampong Cham. The overall experiences remain unchanged.



Discovering Siem Reap

Today, explore the ancient walled city of Angkor Thom, the former great capital of the Khmer Empire from late 12th century until its ultimate decline in the 15th century. Inside the compound, you will be able to visit some of the most mysterious and fascinating structures of the Angkor complex. Start this morning entering the city by the impressive 23-meter-high South Gate and head to Bayon temple. With its 37 towers and enigmatic smiling faces, it is one of the most emblematic temples. Once your guide has shared with you its knowledge and secrets, continue to Baphuon and learn more about the gigantic project of conservation it has undergone to get back at its monumental appearance. Then join the Terrace of Elephants and the Terrace of the Leper King via Phimeanakas, a small yet wonderful temple hidden in a multi-century old forest behind the terraces.

Go back in town for lunch at a local restaurant and relax before going back to visit the world-famous masterpieces that are Ta Prohm and Angkor Wat. Enter Ta Prohm by the West Gate, and be amazed by its detailed and refined bas-reliefs along with the presence of giant trees and roots that are slowly taking over the stones. Finish up your exploration with a visit to Angkor Wat and enjoy the sunset over the emblem of the Kingdom of Wonder.



Embarking on the Mekong Journey

Low Water Season


Siem Reap - Kampong Cham -Angkor Ban

Heritage Line warmly welcomes guests in Siem Reap with a morning coffee before transferring to the Mekong vessel, where the crew assists with staterooms and provides a cabin briefing. After settling in, lunch is served in the restaurant, followed by a welcome and safety session with the cruise director. As the ship sails with the flow of the Mekong, guests can relax on deck before enjoying a sunset gathering with canapés and prosecco, a celebratory dinner, and the option of an evening cinema in the comfortable indoor lounge.




Siem Reap – Kampong Laeang, Tonle River

In the morning, guests are welcomed at our Siem Reap lounge before a short bus ride and local boat transfer to the vessel, your luxurious home for the coming days. Over lunch, the ship glides across the vast Tonle Sap Lake, whose size dramatically shifts between seasons. Spend the afternoon relaxing on deck, enjoying tea with fellow travelers, or indulging in a spa treatment. Before dinner, our expert guide presents insights into the Mekong River and Tonle Lake, and the evening concludes with an optional cinema in the lounge.









Low Water Season

Angkor Ban – Prek Bangkong – Kampong Laeang

Begin the day with Tai Chi on the sundeck before breakfast, then explore Angkor Ban's monastery and village, where you can meet monks, interact with locals, and capture authentic glimpses of Cambodia's rustic lifestyle. Back on board, the ship sails toward Phnom Penh, stopping at Prek Bangkong, a silk-weaving village once home to the Royal family. Here, artisans demonstrate the intricate silk-making process, and you'll visit the heritage house of H.E. Sam-El, a former royal architect. The day ends with scenic sailing past Phnom Penh's skyline, a multi-course dinner, and an evening cinema, before mooring midstream on the Tonle River.

High Water Season

Kampong Laeang – Kampong Tralach – Kampong Cham


In the heart of the Tonle region, we visit Kampong Laeang, a rural village near Kampong Chhnang, where tuk-tuks take us through the countryside to see pottery making, a pre-Angkorian temple, and sweeping views of rice fields and floodplains. After lunch on board, the ship sails south to Kampong Tralach, where an ox-cart ride leads through rice paddies to a small village with a local NGO school and library project, or alternatively, a 300-year-old temple and Buddha shrine. The evening brings onboard entertainment with a fashion show, before the ship sails overnight into the Mekong River.

Countryside & Capital Horizons Low Water Season Kampong Laeang – Kampong Tralach – Phnom Penh Embark on tuk-tuks through Kampong Laeang to witness pottery making, meet villagers, and visit a pre-Angkorian temple, with sweeping views of rice fields stretching into the horizon. Continue to Kampong Tralach, where an ox-cart ride leads past lush paddies to a village community project or an ancient 300-year-old temple. After a scenic lunch and tea onboard, sail further downstream to Phnom Penh, where the ship moors midstream, offering a dazzling view of the capital's skyline.

High Water Season

Prek Bangkong - Angkor Ban -Phnom Penh

The day begins with optional morning Tai Chi as the scenery shifts to the wide Mekong. A visit to Prek Bangkong reveals its silk-weaving community, where artisans demonstrate the intricate process of crafting silk, followed by a stop at the heritage house of a former royal architect. In the afternoon, the journey continues to Angkor Ban, where guests explore a monastery and charming village, meeting monks and locals while experiencing Cambodia's rustic lifestyle. The day ends with a short sail to Phnom Penh, mooring mid-stream with skyline views of the vibrant city.




Discovering Phnom Penh

Phnom Penh

Once known as the "Paris of the East," Phnom Penh combines colonial charm with vibrant modern life. Begin the day with a cyclo ride through the city, then visit the Royal Palace, Silver Pagoda, and the poignant "S21" prison before pausing for lunch in town.

In the afternoon, explore the Sosoro Museum and stroll through the French Quarter, ending at the landmark Wat Phnom. Back on board, enjoy an expert lecture followed by an open-air gala dinner with Apsara dance. Afterward, take time to experience the city's riverside nightlife.








Cruising into Vietnam

Phnom Penh - Border Crossing - Gieng Island

Before leaving Phnom Penh, join a powerful testimony by Mr. Sum Rithy, a survivor of S21 imprisonment and participant in the Khmer Rouge tribunal. This rare opportunity allows guests to hear his story firsthand and engage in meaningful conversation about Cambodia's difficult past.

Once the ship departs, the day is yours to relax—whether at the spa, on the sundeck, or your private balcony. Enjoy stories from the captain, or join a Khmer culinary workshop with our head chef. Over afternoon tea, the ship sails toward Vietnam, entering the vibrant Mekong Delta and mooring near Gieng Island.



Gieng island - My An Hung - Binh Thanh Island

The day begins with morning Tai Chi and breakfast before exploring Gieng Island, or Mango Island, shaded by lush groves. Guests visit an incense workshop to see the handcrafting of fragrant sticks, a traditional boatbuilding site, and a century-old home where fresh mangoes and local tea are shared. This glimpse into daily life along the Mekong captures the region's simplicity and joy.

After lunch, the ship continues to My An Hung Village in Sa Dec province, where visits to a local household and seasonal fields reveal the farming traditions of the delta. Guests enjoy tea and freshly picked fruits, followed by a lively dragon dance performance. The day ends with sunset sailing, cocktails, alfresco snacks, and music on deck before dinner is served.

Islands of Tradition

Binh Thanh Island – Tan Phong Island – My Tho

Awaken to the beauty of the Mekong Delta and begin the day with Tai Chi and breakfast before setting out by local boat to Binh Thanh Island. Meet villagers who have spent generations cultivating water hyacinths, and watch the age-old craft of mat weaving come to life.

Continue to Cai Be to see the traditional making of rice paper, cookies, rice wine, and coconut candies before venturing to Tan Phong Island. Here, taste fresh tropical fruits in a family garden, take a buggy ride through the village, and visit a household weaving water hyacinths into delicate handicrafts. As evening approaches, the ship makes its final sail to My Tho, with a festive farewell atmosphere on board.

Farewell to the Mekong


Savor a final breakfast on board before disembarking in My Tho. A comfortable bus transfer brings you to Saigon, just 70 kilometers away, with arrival by mid-morning.

As your Mekong journey comes to a close, depart with cherished memories of vibrant cultures, timeless traditions, and newfound friendships. The mighty river leaves its mark long after the voyage ends.

DAY 11 Saigon

This morning, take a 2hr drive northwest to the famous Cu Chi Tunnels, an immense network of connecting underground tunnels started in 1948 to protect the Viet Cong guerrillas from the French air and ground sweeps. The tunnels also served as living quarters, communication and supply routes, and housed hospitals, food and weapons caches. Touring the underground compounds will provide a better understanding of the history of the tunnels, the hardship of life in the tunnels and the Vietnamese resilience during combat. Return to Saigon. Stop at a local restaurant for lunch.

Afternoon we continue to the highlights of city tour. With over eight million inhabitants and four million motorbikes, Saigon is truly a city that never sleeps. Despite its modernity, Saigon maintains a strong link to the past and our city tour takes in some of Saigon's most historic landmarks including the Notre Dame Cathedral, a red brick edifice with twin spires constructed from materials imported from France (entrance is only permitted when no services are being performed).

Then head across the square to the Central Post Office, completed in 1891. A short drive away is the former Presidential Palace, the headquarters of the Saigon Government during the American War. Continue to the War Remnants Museum for a vivid perspective of the American War through the eyes of the Vietnamese. (Please note that some of the displays are very graphic.) Experience Saigon's famed street coffee culture while your guide provides a brief language lesson as well as insights into daily life of a Saigonese before returning to your hotel.




