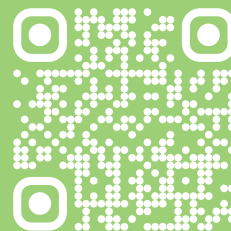

Early Career Teacher Entitlement (ECTE)



The ECTE ensures that all new teachers have access to a two-year programme of structured support and professional development.

As part of the ECTE, both Early Career Teachers (ECTs) and their mentors benefit from high-quality training programmes based on the Initial Teacher Training Core Framework (ITTECF). These programmes are designed around evidence-based practice and cover key areas such as classroom management, subject knowledge, and professional behaviours. Mentor training focuses on developing effective coaching techniques and strategies to provide meaningful support.

These programmes are invaluable because they help ECTs build confidence, refine their teaching skills, and accelerate professional growth during the crucial early stages of their career. At the same time, mentors strengthen their leadership and mentoring expertise, ensuring they can offer consistent, impactful guidance that supports teacher development and improves outcomes for pupils.

ITTECF

The ITTECF offers a single, consistent, and progressive training pathway for teachers, starting from initial training and continuing through the first two years in the classroom. It sets out core 'learn that...' and 'learn how to...' statements, focusing on classroom practice, theory, and pedagogy, ensuring continuity with no gap between initial teacher training and early career induction.

Partnering with a Lead Provider accredited by the DfE, the South Yorkshire Teaching Hub acts as a delivery partner for early career teacher and mentor development programmes, co-ordinating and delivering a single, consistent and progressive training pathway for teachers.

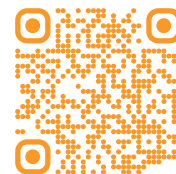

Appropriate Body



The Appropriate Body (AB) is a vital part of teacher development in England. The South Yorkshire Teaching Hub is the Appropriate Body for schools in Sheffield, Rotherham and the surrounding area. With over 13 years' experience, we provide expert oversight and support to ensure Early Career Teachers (ECTs) receive a high-quality statutory induction and the best possible start to their careers.

Our role

- Monitoring support: Ensuring ECTs receive their statutory entitlements and that induction aligns with statutory guidance, including Initial Teacher Training and Early Career Framework (ITTECF) fidelity checks for school-led routes.
- Monitoring assessment: Making the final decision on whether ECTs have met the Teachers' Standards, based on headteacher recommendations.

What we offer

- Expert, personalised support and guidance from dedicated Appropriate Body consultants.
- Registration and monitoring of ECT progress, including statutory reporting to the DfE.
- Quality assurance, with progress reviews, assessment checks and monitoring visits where needed.
- Tools and resources, including access to ECT Manager and an Appropriate Body Toolkit, and Up-to-date statutory induction documentation.

- Clear communication, regular updates, newsletters and networking opportunities.
- Training and events, including headteacher briefings, induction tutor training and ECT welcome events.

Costs

Appropriate Body services: £250 per ECT, per year.

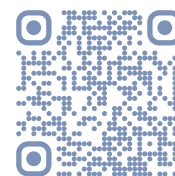
School-led programme: Additional charges apply (from £800 per school). Sliding charge for deviations from the school-led plan may apply.

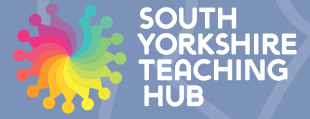
