

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE LABOR FORCE MAY 2025



#### THE BORDERPLEX REGION


- THE LABOR FORCE DECREASED BY 2,406 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY 3,693 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 1,287 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

#### **EL PASO, TX MSA**

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT 4.2%, WITH A TOTAL OF 17,910 UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 5,900 NONFARM JOBS SINCE MAY 2024
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 900 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

#### RURAL COUNTIES (BREWSTER, CULBERSON, JEFF DAVIS, HUDSPETH, AND PRESIDIO COUNTIES)

- THE LABOR FORCE DECREASED BY 211 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS DECREASED BY 251 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 40 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

The three Super Sectors with the **GREATEST** employment for the El Paso MSA in May 2025 were:


- 1. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities

- 3. Information


These three Super Sectors represented 9% of the total nonfarm employment.

#### **EMPLOYMENT in May 2025**












## ACTIVE UI CLAIMANTS BY MONTH BORDERPLEX REGION










