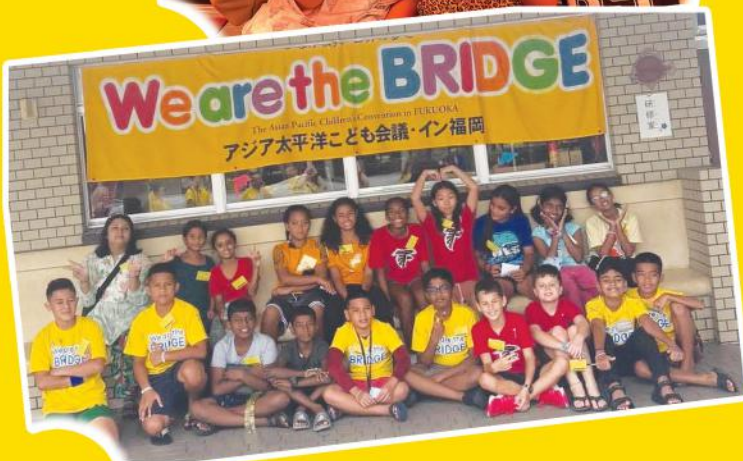

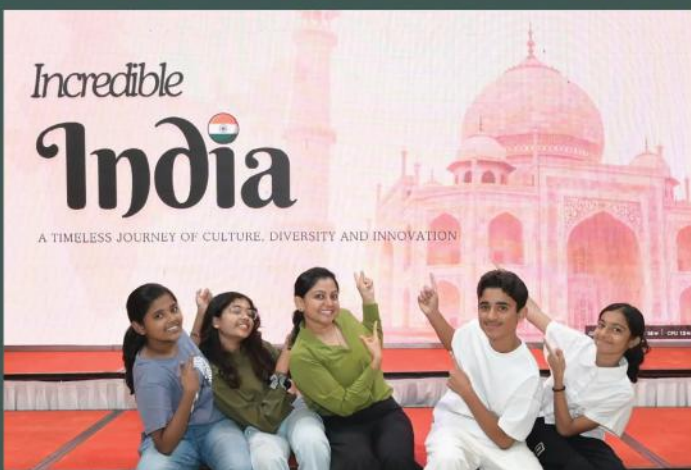


Global Youth Exchange Program (GYEP) 2025

Empower global leaders with international perspectives and tools to navigate challenges and seize opportunities

THEME- "BRIDGING NATIONS-BUILDING LEADERSHIP"



The South Asian Academy for International Leadership (SAAIL) 2025, held from 30 July to 4 August 2025 in Nepal, brought together emerging and experienced leaders from India, Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka for a truly transformative journey of learning, collaboration, and cultural exchange. Over four intensive days—beginning early mornings and stretching well past midnight—the academy created an environment where leadership was not just taught, but lived.

Hosted by JCI Nepal, the academy was held under the inspiring theme "Bridging Nations – Building Leadership" and witnessed the gracious presence and support of national leadership from the South Asian region, including Rajani Thapa, National President of JCI Nepal, Ankur Jhunjhunwala, National President of JCI India, Kazi Fahad, National President of JCI Bangladesh, and Sandun, National President of JCI Sri Lanka.
