Eat The Invaders ft. Barwon Park

The town of Winchelsea has a starring role in the new documentary series "Eat The Invaders" - hosted by popular presenter Tony Armstrong - which premieres Tuesday January 7, at 8.30pm on ABC TV and iview.

Tony Armstrong and the team from Closer Productions were in Winchelsea in April this year to film the series' opening episode, which features the ladies from the Country Women's Association and historian Guy Hull at Barwon Hall.

"Eat The Invaders" looks at Australia's unique biodiversity which is being destroyed by the invasive plants and animals brought here by our colonial ancestors. Pests like cane toads, camels, carp, cats, deer and rabbits have driven many of our native plants and animals to the brink of extinction.

But what if a radical rethink, inspired by Kirsha Kaechele's book Eat the Problem, could help turn this issue into an opportunity? Over six episodes, Tony Armstrong – with the help of scientists, land carers, some famous Aussie faces and an artist and chef from Mona – will attempt to turn our unwanted ecological trash into desirable culinary gold, in a provocative attempt to Eat the Invaders.

Guests include Poh Ling Yeow, Dr Karl Kruszelnicki, Geoffrey Robertson, Claire Hooper, Rona Glynn-McDonald, Warwick Thornton and comic Nat's What I Reckon. In the episode, Tony heads to Barwon Park, where English aristocrat Thomas Austin once introduced 24 rabbits, sparking one of the largest bio-invasions in history. Historian Guy Hull joins Tony and paints a vivid picture of colonial blood sports, on which Austin's empire was built. A CSIRO scientist explains the environmental damage rabbits continue to cause, the science behind various eradication attempts, and questions whether the rabbit problem will ever be fully resolved.

Tony and Guy visit the local butcher to buy wild rabbit but find none are available - so they enlist a local hunter. The hunter bags two rabbits and reflects on his 50 years of ferreting for food – a once-common practice that has become rare.

With the rabbits dressed but no clue how to cook them, Tony and Guy turn to the local Country Women's Association for recipes. The women recall childhood memories of hunting, cooking, and eating rabbits, and how the introduction of viruses to control the population wiped out what was once a national dish.

After tasting a traditional rabbit stew, Tony wonders if this invasive species could make a comeback on modern dinner plates.


At the Winchelsea town hall, Tony tests the CWA's rabbit pies on local kids. Reactions are mixed – some enjoy it, while others don't. Many of the kids have never tasted rabbit before.

Invasion biologists Phill Cassey and

Andy Lowe reveal that the rabbit crisis has cost Australia \$8 billion, pondering how that money could be allocated to their control.

ABC Head of Documentaries and Specialist Susie Jones said: "Eat The Invaders is a highly original series tackling one of the most significant issues in Australia in a fresh, engaging and playfully provocative manner.

"Over six captivating episodes, Tony takes us through the compelling stories of these invasive species, meeting with everyday Australians, experts, scientists and artists in an optimistic quest for solutions. We're delighted to share this series and look forward to the conversations it provokes at dinner tables around the nation."



Adventure Play Space construction on target



Improvements to Winchelsea's Barwon Terrace activity precinct are continuing, with the new Adventure Play Space on target for completion in February.

While the works site will remain fenced off, the adjoining existing playground and new gathering space shelter will be reopened in time for the Christmas break.

An arbour has been added to the side of the shelter for growing of vines across the top, providing additional shade. Bricks retained from the former mud hut on the



site have been used in construction of a path at the rear of the shelter.

A community-led cob wall construction project is expected to be completed in March.

A power pole beside the shelter will be removed.

The Adventure Play Space will adjoin the existing playground and feature a flying fox with wheelchair access and accessible seat, slide, elevated cubby pods and more.

Memorial Grandstand upgrade

Work on Winchelsea's Eastern Reserve Memorial Grandstand upgrade is scheduled to start early in 2025.

The project will improve accessibility to and use of space in the building, which was built in 1923 as a functional memorial to soldiers who served in the First World War.

The heritage-listed building has been home to Winchelsea RSL Sub Branch for more than 100 years and is highly valued by members, families and the wider community.

Upgrades will include:

- Construction of a new entry ramp.
- Removal of a false ceiling and shower cubicle to create more space.

The \$59,728 project is being jointly funded, with \$49,728 from the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing via the Victorian Veterans Capital Works Program 2023-24, and \$10,000 in-kind from Winchelsea RSL Sub Branch.

Council is managing the project in collaboration with the RSL branch.

Safety Improvements To Support Truck Deliveries In Winchelsea Town Centre

Surf Coast Shire Council is working with Powercor, WorkSafe and local businesses to create a safer environment for truck deliveries in the Winchelsea town centre.

The work is in response to concerns raised this year about deliveries via the Hesse Street loading zone, namely:

- the steep road camber close to the kerb, which poses a risk when unloading from trucks;
- low powerlines above the loading zone; and
- the need for trucks to complete multi-point turns on Hesse Street to rejoin the highway.

Local businesses tabled a petition during Council's September meeting highlighting the importance of the loading zone to their operations.

A response to the petition presented during Tuesday night's Council meeting detailed solutions that have either been implemented or will soon be put in place:

Raising powerlines: Powercor has increased the height of the powerlines to 5.4 metres, providing safe clearance for trucks.

Re-marking the loading zone:

Council will widen the loading zone by 1.5 metres before Christmas. This will allow trucks to park further from the kerb on a flatter part of the road, making unloading safer. The street will remain wide enough to support unrestricted two-way traffic.

 Medium-term kerb works: Council is investigating works to the kerb itself that would reduce the camber of the loading zone and increase pedestrian and vehicle safety.

Additionally, Council has started discussions with businesses about the use of spotters during truck departures from Hesse Street.



This solution was suggested via the September petition and would be a way of increasing safety for trucks and other road users during multi-point turns.

Winchelsea Ward councillor Tony Phelps acknowledged the importance of the loading zone.

"Local businesses rely on this loading zone and Council officers have been working on safety solutions to make sure it can stay in its current location," Cr Phelps said.

"The changes will be reviewed at the end of June next year to check that they've been effective."

Agm Wurdale & Surrounds Recovery Network (W&SRN) Report 2023/2024

The 2024 reporting period for the W&SRN has largely been one of Review & Consolidation of the Community Recovery after Disaster plan. Some pre-planning of other initiatives has also begun, and actions partially completed.

A restriction of funding has forced the postponement of a number of planned exercises both Intra and Extra to the W&SRN Committee participation.

One notable achievement for the reporting period has been the production and distribution of a double sided "Community Safety Checklist" towards the end of 2023. This checklist was modified from examples supplied by Mandy Baker, (Surf Coast Shire), to better suit the requirements of the Wurdale & Surrounds community. Feedback from the community has been very positive. A copy of this checklist is available on request to wurdalerecovery@gmail.com

Discussions have continued with the SCS on how to reach both younger and newer community members with "Recovery after Disaster"& "Community Safety" stories.

It has been suggested that W&SRN should involve community groups such as Landcare, CFA and other community organizations to contribute relevant brochures, "Safety Games" other relevant documentation for collation into a "Community Safety Showbag". The intention is to have a simple information pack that could be aimed at particular focus audiences e.g. new community residents or school children. The information is largely available, so collation & distribution is required by community volunteers and W&SRN members.

The coming summer is again forecast to

be a potentially bad season. Rainfall for year ending July 2024 has been the lowest on record for the Otways and South –West Victoria. There are potential fire implications for residents living in these areas from high, dry fuel loads and poor water catchment in particular. Pre-preparation is the key to ensuring both properties and an informed Community are safe during these times.





Our collection truck drivers will have the day off on Christmas Day (Wednesday 25 December). As they work to catch up, this means residential bins in some areas will be emptied on the day following your usual collection day.

So during the week of Christmas only:

- bins normally emptied on
 Wednesday will be emptied on
 Thursday
- bins normally emptied on Thursday will be emptied on Friday
- bins normally emptied on Friday will be emptied on Saturday.

Collections will return to the normal schedule from Monday, 30 December 2024.

Extra collections

All residential properties that receive a kerbside bin service will also receive an **extra landfill** and **extra recycling** bin collection during the festive season.

To check how the bin collection changes affect you, and to see when your extra collections will be:

It's free and provides bin night reminders, an A-Z recycling guide, and notifications about unexpected changes to collections e.g truck breakdowns

Extra glass? Extra recycling?

Household amounts of sorted recycling (plastics numbered 1, 2 & 5, metal cans & tins, paper and cardboard), and glass bottles and jars can be dropped off at the Anglesea, Lorne and Winchelsea transfer stations for FREE.

Fire Danger Days

On days of **Extreme** or **Catastrophic** Fire Danger Rating, waste services may be impacted. This may include changes to kerbside collections or opening hours at transfer stations and the Anglesea Landfill.


Winchelsea Rural Fire Brigade was formed in 1929, merging with the Winchelsea Urban Fire Brigade in 2007.

The first fire call was on 1/6/1943 in a shop occupied by Leuitenant C.Patten.

A new fire station was built 4/5/1959 and officially opened 20/11/1959.

On 30/6/1962 the first urban truck arrived. It was a 1938 Dodge.

A new tower was erected in July 1972. On 1/6/1992 the last meeting was held in the fire station. Trucks and all equipment were moved to a temporary station in Knuckeys old shed in Hesse Street and in August 1992 the old station was pulled down and work began on a new station.



Changes To Christmas Waste Collections

Kerbside bin collection will return to normal collection day on Monday 30 December 2024.



There are no days off or shortened Christmas hours at Wildlife Rescue Rangers here in Winchelsea. Barb and her team of volunteers take in, help and rehabilitate injured and orphaned wildlife from across the district and sometimes as far as Melbourne and Ballarat. There is currently 42 animals in care at the rescue 4 young brush tail possums, 7 ringtails, 6 magpies, 13 ducklings, 1 adult duck, 3 currawongs, 5 rainbow lorikeets, 1 butcher bird, 2 wattle birds, 1 mudlark and 2 crimson rosellas, with



more being brought in daily. The Christmas period means more traffic on the roads and warmer weather so there is expected to be many more animals needing help.

To assist in the care of all of the wildlife that spends time at the shelter, we're asking the Winchelsea community to consider donating to Wildlife Rescue Rangers this Christmas.

The Shelter requires the following items to continue to assist all the animals in care.

Free Financial Help For Victorians Facing Mortgage Stress

Victorians struggling with their mortgage repayments can now access Australia's only free service dedicated to helping homeowners stay in control of their finances, thanks to support from the Allan Labor Government.

Attorney-General Jaclyn Symes this week announced the statewide expansion of Mortgage Stress Victoria (MSV) – supporting even more Victorians with expert legal, financial, and social work support both in-person and remotely.

Initially funded as part of a \$31.1 million Labor Government investment in the legal assistance sector in the Victorian Budget 2021/22, the service started as a pilot in Melbourne's western suburbs.

MSV's team of financial counsellors, lawyers and social workers help homeowners by negotiating affordable repayments and protecting their legal rights as well as offering emotional support.

Since 2022, MSV has helped prevent home repossession in more than 190 cases, with around one-third of its clients being victim-survivors of family violence.

Julia from Tullamarine faced mortgage stress after falling ill and being unemployed for two years. With support from MSV, she was able to keep her home.

MSV's financial counselling team helped her manage her mortgage, while their social work team provided vital support, emergency relief referrals and help to retrain and rebuild her future.

MSV can help at any stage of mortgage stress, whether the payments are up to date or if there are court orders for repossessing your home. Victorians can access support if they live in their mortgaged primary residence, own only one property and have a household income of \$75,000 or less, or are affected by family violence.


