Meghalaya Legislative Assembly project, has been in the pipeline since 2001 and hasn't seen any progress in almost 2 decades. Following the formation of MDA government in 2018, Hon'ble CM had taken cognizance of the project. From being decisive on identification of the site for the project to pooling of the funds from various sources, government has worked on war footing.

The project will be inaugurated in Golden Jubilee Year - 2022, even after facing severe hurdles due to the pandemic. It envisions the cultural heritage of the Hill State and embeds the pride of Meghalaya on the national landscape.

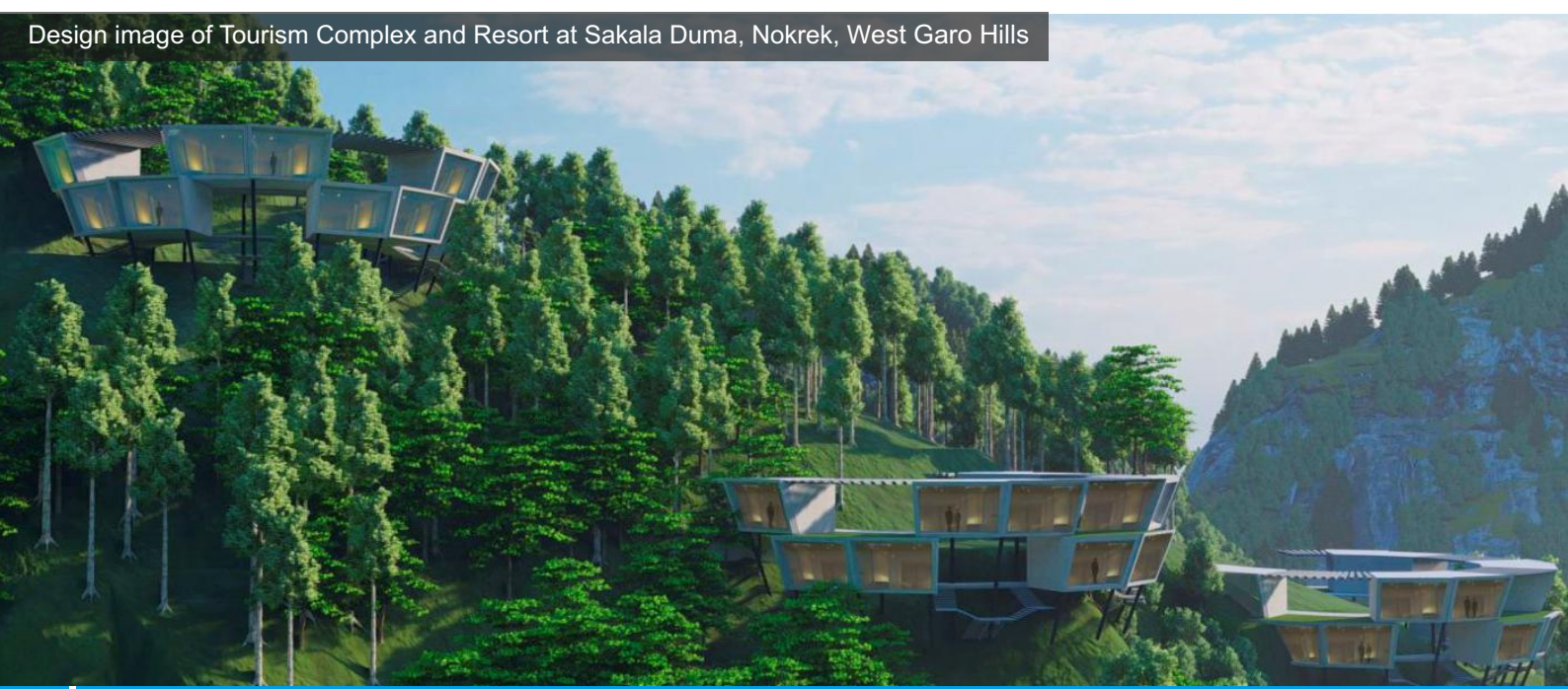

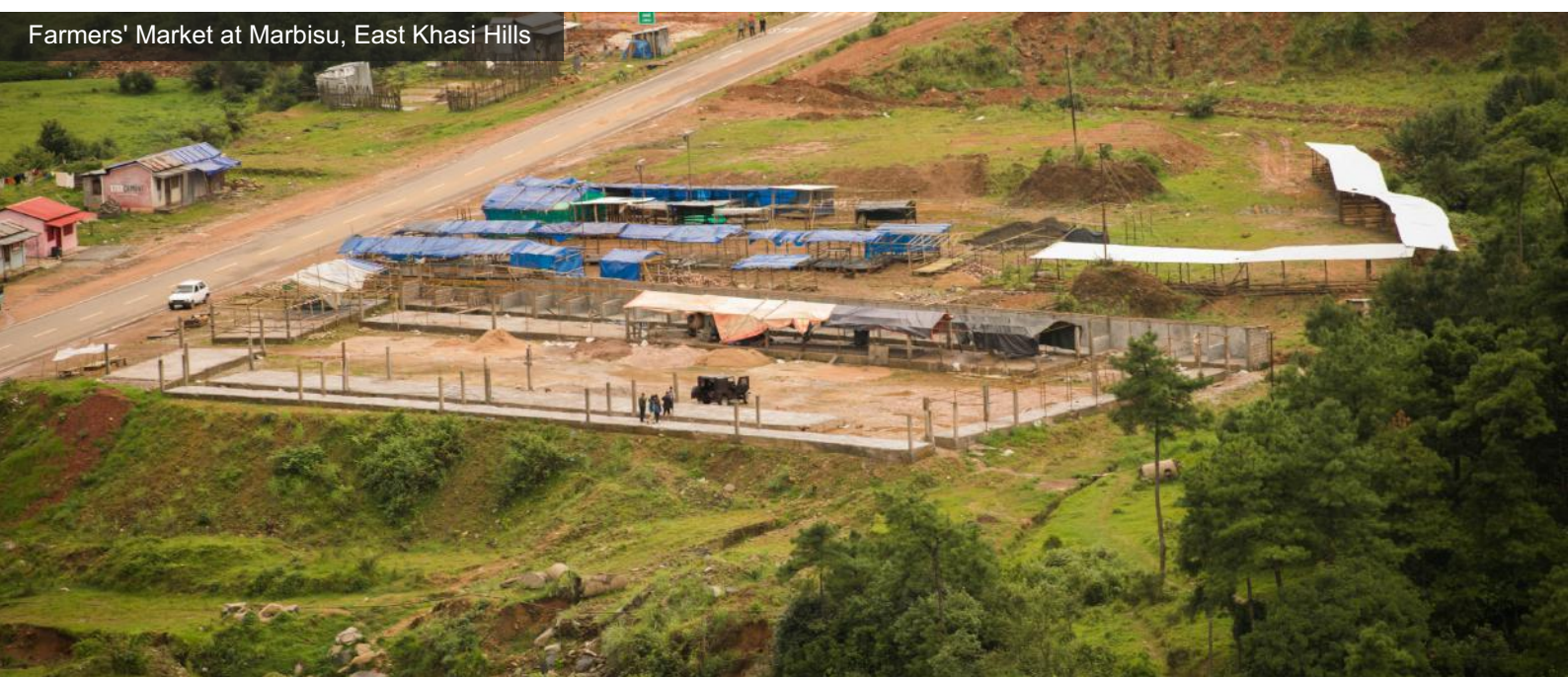

The government made commendable interventions in bringing development to different sectors, esp. the livelihood of people through formation of Cooperatives. Last couple of years a good number of new Cooperatives were instituted for the benefit of the people. The implementation of schemes under Piggery Mission, Agriculture, Horticulture, Poultry, Dairy Mission etc are one of the examples of government's larger vision for the development of the state through societies and individuals.

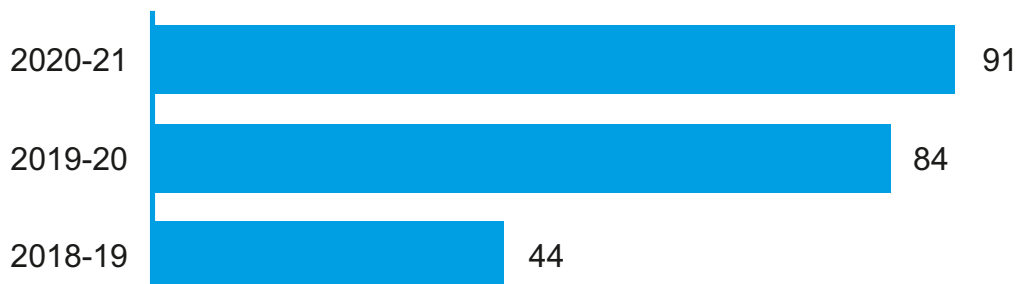

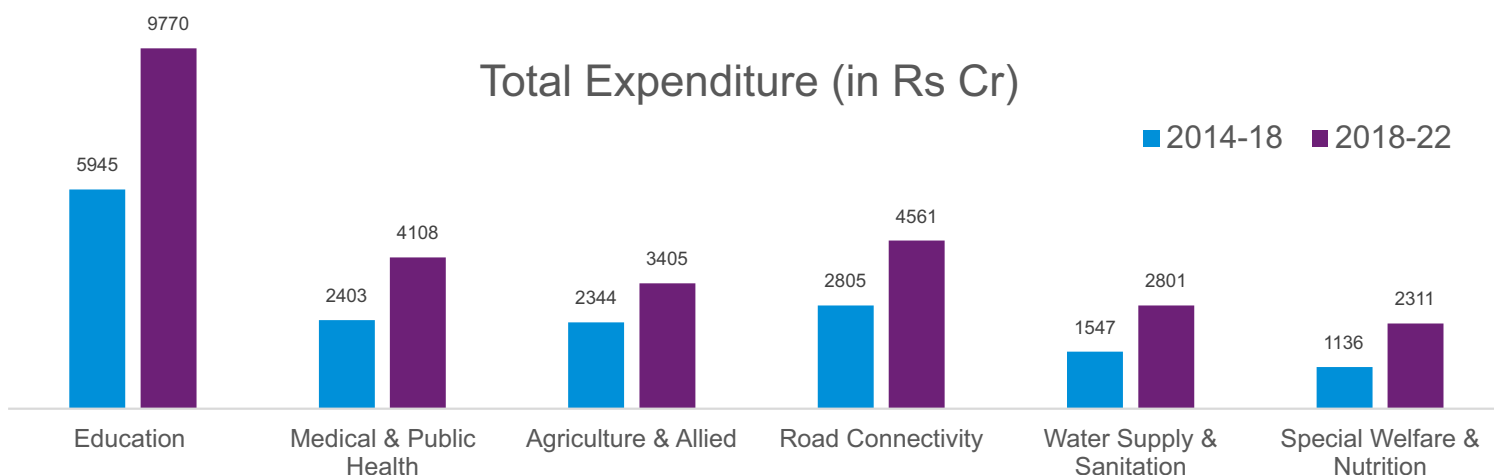
