





### Community **Collaboration Is Key**

Our community partnerships have shaped StepUp's 35-year history. Together, we have addressed complex issues and created sustainable outcomes.

Our extensive network of over 75 community partners refer participants to our program, provide them with resources, and serve as our "village" in this work. Some of the partners we work with include Wheels 4 Hope, The Green Chair Project, and Note in the Pocket. These partners provide participants with transportation, furnish homes for those who are coming out of homelessness, crisis, or disaster, and contribute clothing to StepUp children.

StepUp participant Amy S. is the perfect example of this holistic partnership. After 20 years incarcerated, Amy found her way to StepUp Ministry with the help of ARISE Collective. Through StepUp's programming, she was outfitted by Dress for Success, received a vehicle from Wheels 4 Hope, and now works as a Donations Coordinator for The Green Chair Project. We are so proud of Amy's accomplishments and her continued relationship with StepUp. And, we love the community of partners that supported her.

## Employment

#### **Partnering for Program Enhancement**

In response to the new employment landscape, over the last two years StepUp has been evolving our Employment Academy offerings. We have been piloting new program content and class formats to better serve the unemployed, underemployed, and justice-involved.

The Truist Foundation's generous grant of \$250,000 supports our ambitious Employment Academy goals, and over the next three years, allow us to strengthen our curriculum to better serve our community. Our program emphasizes four core competencies: adaptability, communication, professionalism, and time management. As a result, participants leave the program with a resume, networking and interview skills, as well as the ability to communicate their past while focusing on their future.

These efforts are already yielding results. This year, the number of individuals in our program who have secured employment has increased by almost 38%. Over the past year, the percentage of participants who obtained jobs with benefits has tripled to 24%, and the average wage has increased to \$16.26 an hour.



## **Building Confidence and Community in Teens**

When Marcus P. was a rising junior in high school, he was invited to check out StepUp's Real World Program by his friend, Malachi. Eager to acquire business skills and intrigued by the positive things he had heard about the program, Marcus decided to give Real World a try. That's when he was introduced to a community of supportive staff, dedicated volunteers, and like-minded peers. This inclusive and welcoming environment made an impression on him, and he quickly recognized there was a wealth of new opportunities available to him through the Real World.

One of Marcus' greatest takeaways was his ability to overcome his social anxiety and fear of public speaking. He had always felt uncomfortable speaking in front of groups, but with the program's support and lots of practice, he now speaks with confidence.

Having experienced transformation himself, Marcus believes the program could also benefit the people closest to him. A true community builder, Marcus now brings his group of friends to the Real World every Tuesday evening.

## **Impact**

#### **Tiffany W: Taking Initiative**

At the time Tiffany W. entered StepUp's Employment Academy Program, she was underemployed, living with family, and seeking gainful employment to support herself and her seven-year-old son, Gio. Two months after enrolling in the program, Tiffany landed a full-time job, changed her life's trajectory, and ignited her passion for transformation.

Having found so much success with StepUp initially, Tiffany decided to enroll in the 48-week Life Skills Academy. She immersed herself in financial literacy classes, worked to strengthen her parenting skills through the Triple P program, and learned how to create SMART (specific, measurable, achievable, realistic, and timebound) goals. Gio was enrolled in StepUp's Children's Program and quickly made friends while also learning important skills like conflict-resolution. Even though Tiffany and Gio's drive to StepUp temporarily increased to an hour each way due to a relocation, to Tiffany, that drive was always a means to a better life.

Through StepUp partner Wheels 4 Hope, Tiffany received a reliable car. When she began her search for safe and secure housing for her and Gio, Tiffany knew exactly where to turn. She took StepUp Ministry's Ready to Rent class and worked towards her first apartment, moving into it two months later, fully furnished

through StepUp's partnership with The Green Chair Project. Through StepUp, Tiffany had access to all the resources she needed to support her family.

As a recent graduate of the Life Skills Academy, Tiffany knows she has gained a network of support that will assist her wherever her future takes her. In addition to currently working towards a degree in Human Services Technology, Tiffany is an active member of StepUp's Alumni program, where she now serves as a resource to others.
