Legendary Umpire Dicky Bird dies aged 92

Harold Dennis "Dickie" Bird, one of cricket's most beloved and iconic figures, has died peacefully at his home at the age of 92

Yorkshire County Cricket Club confirmed the news, describing Bird as "one of the most prominent umpires of his era" and "a true character in Yorkshire's history."

Born in Barnsley in 1933, Bird began his cricketing journey as a player for Yorkshire and Leicestershire before a knee injury ended his playing career. He turned to umpiring in 1970 and went on to officiate in 66 Test matches and 69 One Day Internationals, including three World Cup finals. His warmth, eccentricity, and fairness made him a household name

far beyond the boundary ropes.

Bird's popularity transcended sport. His autobiography became the best-selling sports autobiography of its time, and he was a regular on television, known for his humorous anecdotes and deep love for the game. In 2014, he was named President of Yorkshire CCC, a role he held with pride as the club won two County Championship titles during his tenure

Tributes have poured in from across the cricketing world, with many remembering his signature white hat, expressive gestures, and the emotional farewell he received at Lord's in 1996, where he was given a guard of honour by England and India players.

Three Women's Premier Leagues to Launch in 2026

Yorkshire's women's and girls' cricket is set for a transformative leap forward, with the Yorkshire Cricket Foundation (YCF) formally announcing the creation of three new Regional Women's Premier Leagues, launching in the 2026 season. This move marks a significant milestone in the ongoing growth and professionalisation of the women's game across the county.

The decision comes as women's cricket in Yorkshire experiences record expansion, with the number of women's teams rising from 189 in 2023 to over 300 currently active. This surge reflects both the dedication of volunteers and a growing appetite for the women's game at all levels.

The three new Premier Leagues—covering North/East, West, and South Yorkshire—are designed to “enhance opportunities, reduce barriers to participation, and strengthen the pathway between recreational and elite cricket,” according to the YCF. The structure was developed after extensive consultation with clubs, volunteers, players, Yorkshire County Cricket Club (YCCC), and the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB).

Grace Pearson, Head of Women & Girls at YCF, described the move as “a pivotal moment for women's and girls' cricket in Yorkshire,” highlighting ambitions to raise standards and create stronger links between grassroots and elite pathways.

- **Regional Focus:** Each Premier League will serve a specific re-

gion (North/East, West, South), aiming to reduce travel and ensure consistent standards.

- **Pathway Integration:** All YCCC Academy and Emerging Player Programme (EPP) players will be affiliated with a Regional Premier League club and expected to represent them when available, distributing talent more evenly and strengthening club sides.

- **Phased Transition:** The new structure will be phased in, with full integration expected by 2028. Existing leagues, such as the Yorkshire Women & Girls Cricket League, may continue independently during the transition but will not receive the same benefits or direct links to the county pathway.

- **Competition Format:** The leagues will initially feature 6–10 teams playing 30-over

hardball cricket, moving to 40 overs and a countywide T20 Cup by 2027, with ambitions for 12 teams per league by 2028.

Gavin Hamilton, General Manager at YCCC, called the initiative “a critical and exciting advancement for Yorkshire cricket,” emphasising its role in expanding participation and elevating playing standards. The move is also seen as a step towards aligning women's league cricket with the men's accredited leagues, though formal ECB Premier League accreditation for women's leagues may follow in the future.

Consultations with clubs are ongoing, and expressions of interest are being gathered. The YCF and YCCC will continue to work with local leagues to ensure a smooth transition and sustainable future for the women's game.

Doncaster City Appoint John Powney After Shock Exit of Joint Managers

Doncaster City have moved swiftly to appoint John Powney as their new first-team manager following the dramatic departure of joint bosses Nick Buxton and Mark Atkins.

The managerial shake-up comes just four months after Buxton and Atkins were appointed to lead the club into their first season in the Northern Counties East League Division One, following promotion from the Central Midlands Premier Division North. Despite a spirited comeback win against Harrogate Railway Athletic last weekend, tensions behind the scenes came to a head.

In a candid social media post on Sunday evening, September 14, Buxton an-

nounced the duo's exit, citing frustrations over budget cuts and a lack of respect from within the club. “Well that brings mine and Atko's time at @DoncasterCityFC to an end,” he wrote. “Results haven't been good enough but when you cut a budget, go to a game with 11 players and beat a team in 2nd with kids and don't get any respect, then something is wrong. Who'd be a manager.”

The club, currently sitting 15th in the table, confirmed the appointment of John Powney on Monday September 15. Powney, who has previously worked in youth development and lower league management, is expected to bring stability and fresh energy to a side that has struggled to



adapt to the demands of Step 6 football.

Powney's first game in charge was a 0-0 draw at Crowle Colts less than 48 hours after his appointment but then this was followed by disappointment, as Doncaster City were

knocked out of the FA Vase with a 4-1 defeat away to Prestwich Heys. The result highlighted the challenges ahead for the new manager, who will now turn his attention to rebuilding confidence and consistency in the league campaign.

Doncaster Teen Claims Yorkshire Belt After Knockout Season Start

Coach Danny Maddison concurs. “A proud moment for Junior and his family but also four out boxing team. coming forward a bit more, but that's what led to the goal. Taking advantage of the men committed forward, Hebburn went on the counter down the left wing. One whipped in ball from the left that was knocked down, though questions remain if there was a foul on Connor Smythe in the build-up, and Hermengildo da Silva was there to volley home.

Frustratingly even though there was time left for Stocksbridge to equalise, they failed to muster much in response. There wasn't even an attempt at late drama and nothing to persuade the fans to stick around for all of stoppage time. Stocksbridge still remain without a win.

Glimmer of Hope Amid September Struggles

Hallam Football Club has endured a turbulent September in the Pitching In Northern Premier League East Division. Despite flashes of promise and individual brilliance, the Countrymen have struggled to convert performances into consistent results, leaving manager Craig Denton with much to ponder as autumn

sets in. The month began with a frustrating run of three consecutive defeats, culminating in a 3-1 loss to Pontefract Collieries. But on a rain-soaked afternoon at Sandygate Road, Hallam showed resilience, clawing back to earn a 1-1 draw against Blyth Spartans. Brodie Litchfield, the club's top scorer, netted his sixth of the season in the 70th minute, salvaging a point and snapping the losing

streak. Denton made a tactical adjustment for the Blyth clash, bringing in Mason Warren to replace the suspended Janni Lipka. The return of fan favourite James Cadman to the squad added a morale boost, though he featured only briefly. Hallam's attacking intent was evident throughout the match, with four clear chances in the first half denied by Blyth's keeper Callum Dobson and desperate goal-line clearances. The equaliser came after relentless pressure, with Litchfield finishing from a goal-mouth scramble. Despite late drama—including a near miss from Harrison Poulter and strong penalty ap-

peals—the match ended in a draw. The momentum from the Blyth draw was short-lived. Hallam travelled to Woodhorn Lane to face Ashington, where they fell 2-1 in a tightly contested match. Craig Spooner opened the scoring for the hosts in the 31st minute, and Josh Gilchrist doubled the lead early in the second half, despite Hallam's protests over a suspected offside. Harrison Poulter gave Hallam hope with a well-taken goal in the 58th minute—his first for the club—cutting through defenders and finishing low into the corner. But the match ended in controversy, with captain Danny South and Ashing-

ton's Liam Henderson both receiving straight red cards for an off-the-ball incident in the dying minutes. The defeat extended Hallam's winless run in September to four matches, with only one point gained from a possible twelve. Their current league position—15th out of 22—reflects the inconsistency, though their goal difference remains neutral at 9:9, suggesting competitive performances even in defeat.

Manager Craig Denton, who has overseen Hallam's rise through the divisions since his appointment in 2020, remains optimistic. Under his leadership, the club earned promotion last season via the play-offs, and while this campaign has been challenging, the squad has shown glimpses of quality. Litchfield's scoring form, South's defensive leadership, and emerging talents like Poulter offer hope for a turnaround.

Horbury, Harrogate Hold Nerve in Shootout Thrillers!

The Road to Wembley is paved with passion, heart-break, and unforgettable moments—and this weekend's Second Round Qualifying in the Isuzu FA Vase delivered all three in abundance. With 22 ties involving Macron NCEL sides, the competition saw fierce rivalries, nail-biting shoot-outs, and standout performances across the board.

Brigg Town came out on top in one of five all-NCEL clashes, defeating Athersley Recreation 2-0 thanks to goals from Adam Drury and Dayle Hutson. Crowle Colts edged a thriller against Dearne & District, racing to a 2-0 lead inside seven minutes through Ben Johnson's penalty & Lewis Graham before surviving a late scare to win 3-2 with a 90th minute strike from Ashton Short. Dearne's replies came from a Joe Hare own goal and Jamie Austin.

Goole AFC and Horbury Town served up a classic at the Victoria Pleasure Ground, sharing eight goals before Horbury triumphed 5-4 on penalties. Harrogate Railway Athletic also held their nerve from the spot, progressing past Thackley after a 1-1 draw.

Liversedge, meanwhile, cruised through with a 4-0 win over Parkgate, Lewis Barlow netting twice. Penistone Church, Tadcaster Albion, Rossington Main, and Maltby Main all claimed wins against teams from other leagues. Penistone won 2-1 at North West Counties side Ashville with goals scored by Robert Ludlam and Sam Scrivens.

Tadcaster Albion progressed with a 4-1 win at Northern League Grangetown Boys Club, coming back after conceding an early goal to comfortably go through with goals by Matthew Mulhearn, Alexander Clark & an Oliver Green brace. Rossington Main

saw off the challenge of former NCEL side Dronfield Town who are now playing in the United Counties League, going through 4-0 with player manager Greg Young, Mitchell Langton, Paul Sherburn & Khalid Suleiman all finding the net.

Maltby also faced former NCEL opponents, going through after a 3-2 win at UCL side Staveley Miners Welfare. Scorers for Maltby were Jake Holdsworth, Curtis Morrison & Jordan Buckham.

Barton Town and Eccleshill United joined them in the next round via shoot-outs, with Barton edging Retford FC and Eccleshill overcoming Park View AFC.

Armthorpe Welfare (2-6 at home to Darwen), Wakefield AFC (4-3 away at Chadderton), Doncaster City (1-4 against Prestwich Heys) and Bottesford Town (1-4 at Retford United) all bowed out, while Sheffield were denied by Burscough in a tense penalty shootout after a 2-2 draw.

Joe West & Blake Freeman found the net for the hosts. Louth Town (0-1 at Newark & Sherwood), Pickering Town (0-1 at home to Yarm & Eaglescliffe) and Kna-

resborough Town (0-3 at four-time Vase winners Whitley Bay) suffered narrow defeats. Nostell Miners Welfare (0-4 at home to Droylesden) and Glasshoughton Welfare (0-8 at Ramsbottom United) endured heavy losses.

Route One Rovers saw their tie postponed due to a waterlogged pitch at Holker Old Boys, but Champion wrapped up the weekend with a 3-1 win over Padiham, Max Dickinson bagging a brace.

Despite the FA Vase fixtures, five league games still took place. In the Premier Division, Beverley Town surged into fourth with a 4-0 win at Wombwell Town, McCauley Snelgrove scoring twice with Nathan Ofori & Glen Sani also on the score-sheet.

Division One saw Worsbrough Bridge Athletic make 9 successive wins and rise to second after a 4-2 victory at Selby Town. Worsbrough were 3-0 up just after the hour mark with Keelan Grist's double and a third from Harrison Marvin. Selby pulled one back through Liam Flanagan before Josh Brown restored the visitors three goal advantage. Flanagan's second of the game reduced the arrears

but it was the visitors who went home with the points, an impressive 9th consecutive win in the League.

Leeds UFCA stunned Club Thorne Colliery 2-0 with a goal in each half, Omar Sanyang & Lewis Harding with the decisive strikes.

Ilkley Town held off a South Leeds comeback to win 3-2, and Winterton Rangers claimed a vital 3-2 win over Appleby Frodingham in a local derby, all the goals coming in a frantic first half.

In the midweek games, there was a FA Cup 2nd Round Qualifying replay and Holker Old Boys cruised into the next round with a commanding 3-0 win over NCEL side Route One Rovers in a game played on Tuesday evening after the original tie was postponed on Saturday due to a waterlogged pitch.. Charlie McGladdery opened the scoring early on (8'), before brother Joseph doubled the lead midway through the second half (72'). Luke Davey capped off the night with a stoppage-time strike (90') in front of 80 spectators.

There was also cup action in the Sheffield & Hallamshire FA County Senior Cup. Penistone Church ran riot at AFC Dronfield, hitting six without reply. Sam Scrivens was the star of the show, netting four (42', 43', 82', 88') alongside goals from Leon Hurles-Brook (38') and Nathan Keightley (53'). Frickley Athletic edged past SJR Worksop 1-0 thanks to Cody Collins' 67th-minute winner.

Dearne & District also impressed, dispatching Oughtibridge WMFC 6-2 at home in a high-scoring affair. Eccleshill United produced a ruthless display to beat Albion Sports 4-1 away. Goals from

Hamza Diallo (35'), Mark Ferguson (47'), Cole Roberts (71'), and Joseph Storey (77') overwhelmed the hosts, who briefly rallied through Mohammed Qasim (53').

In the Premier Division Barton Town salvaged a point with a last-gasp equaliser from Thomas McDonald (90') after Danny Edwards had given Knaresborough Town the lead (51'). Horbury Town edged Sheffield 1-0 courtesy of Gibril Bojang's 68th-minute strike, while Tadcaster Albion left it late to beat Rossington Main 1-0, Oli Johnson netting in the 82nd minute.

Armthorpe Welfare enjoyed a 3-1 win over Maltby Main in Division One. Cole Patrick (20') and Bayley Lowe (26') gave them a first-half cushion, with Mitch Pattinson sealing the result (73') after Basile Zottos had pulled one back (64').

Appleby Frodingham edged a five-goal thriller at Ilkley Town, winning 3-2. Joshua Fraiwald (4') and a Nicholas Brayshaw own goal (45') gave them the lead, before Thomas Hipwell's late goal (78') secured the points. Kevin Gonzalez (43') and Joe Snowden (51') had kept Ilkley in the hunt.

Brigg Town and Crowle Colts shared the spoils in a 3-3 classic. The visitors raced into a 3-1 lead through Henry Cook (2'), Alfie Fudge (7'), and Ashton Short (42'), but Brigg roared back via James Petronzio (21'), Mason Ellender (55'), and Joshua Jordan (90') in front of a bumper crowd of 356.

South Leeds, now managed by former Frickley manager Tom Claisse, beat Glasshoughton Welfare 2-1, with goals from William Law (9') and Shay Muirhead (50') overturning an early strike from William Mendonca (19').

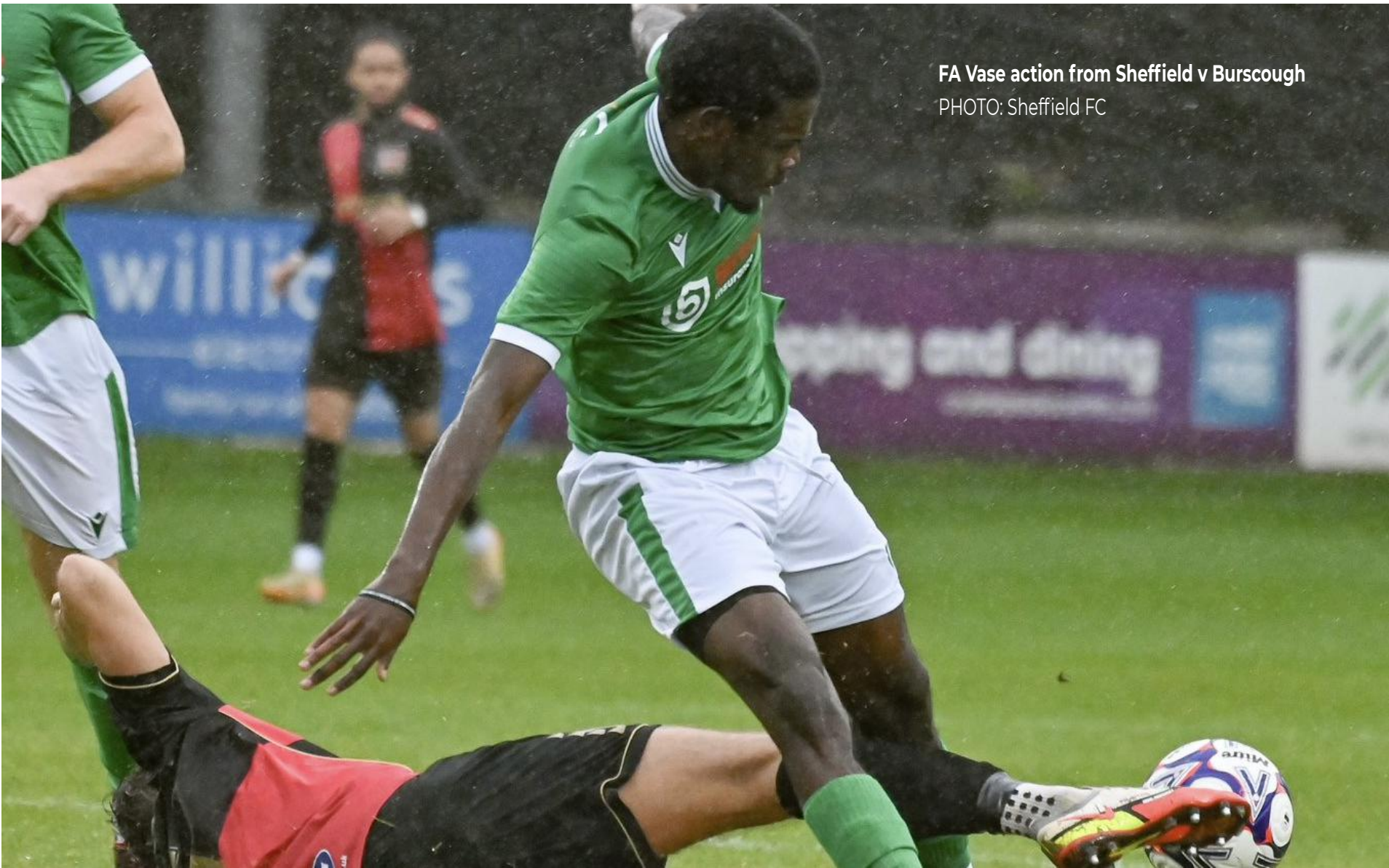

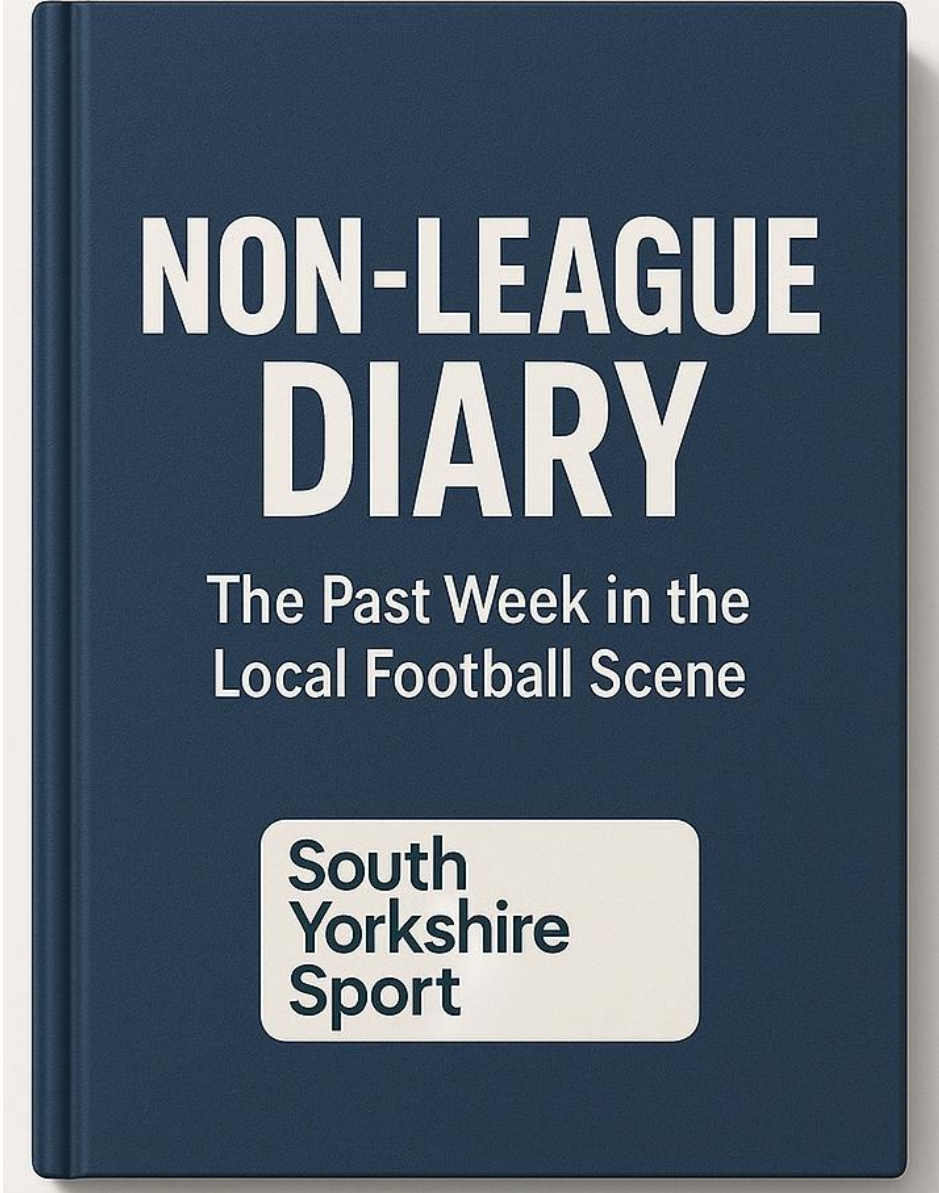

In league action, Swallownest FC continued their solid start to life in the United Counties League Division One with a narrow 2-1 away win over Rainworth Miners Welfare.

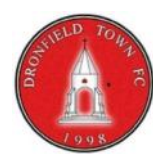
The visitors took the lead in the first half through Liam Arnold, who fin-ished smartly after

From Durkar to Derby – Cup Dreams and Title Schemes Collide!

Barnsley Women recorded a 4-0 home victory over Kidderminster Harriers to keep themselves firmly in the thick of things in this season's FA Women's National League Division One Midlands title race. Jemima Jarvis gave Barnsley the advantage at the interval with Jodie Snelson adding a brace after Ocean Rolandsen and doubled the score early in the second half.

The top four teams all won, three of them by a four goal margin. Barnsley's goal difference of 14 is only bettered by leaders Peterborough United (21) with no other team yet to break into double figures.

The only points dropped by the leading quartet have come in games between themselves, Barnsley narrowly losing at Boldmere St Michaels and then winning at Leafield Athletic.

Sheffield FC are

fifth in the table, five points adrift of fourth place. They were denied victory by a stoppage time goal at Northampton Town in a game played before a healthy crowd at Sixfields Stadium.

Imogen Fowler gave Sheffield the lead at the interval and she crossed for Lexie Butterworth to head Sheffield back in front in the last five minutes. The point was Sheffield's first away from home, their previous two games on their travels being against teams in the top four.

Doncaster Rovers Belles still seek their first away point in Division One North where their travels have taken them to each of the current top three. Jodie Gregory scored Belles' first goal in those games, but it was just a consolation in a 6-1 defeat at Stockport County who started the day as the division's joint top scorers and ended it a goal ahead of Huddersfield who are second, ahead of County on goal difference with both

three points behind Cheadle Town Stingers who maintained their 100% record.

This Sunday's action sees the third and final games in the Group stages of the League Cup which then evolves into a straight knock out competition (32 teams) along with the Plate (also 32 teams).

With 88 teams split into 22 groups of four, trying to do "in play" updates would be a thankless task. All the bottom placed teams exit along with the two third placed teams with the worst record.

Based on the current standings and Sunday's scheduled games, then, of the four local teams, Barnsley are the most likely to exit completely. Sheffield FC will advance from Group P

if they avoid defeat at home to leaders Derby County. If Sheffield close, then they will remain on 3 points and await the outcome of the Lincoln United v Notts County game when a Lincoln win would see three teams finish on three points.

The Adobe Women's FA Cup second round qualifying did not disappoint when it came to drama.

Brunsmear Athletic won 6-4 at home to Rotherham United in a tie where the visitors opened through Ella Mortimer after just four minutes. Handsworth were comfortable 5-0 home winners over Millmoor Juniors. Both Tia Stancill and Abby Watkinson scored twice with Demi West also on target.

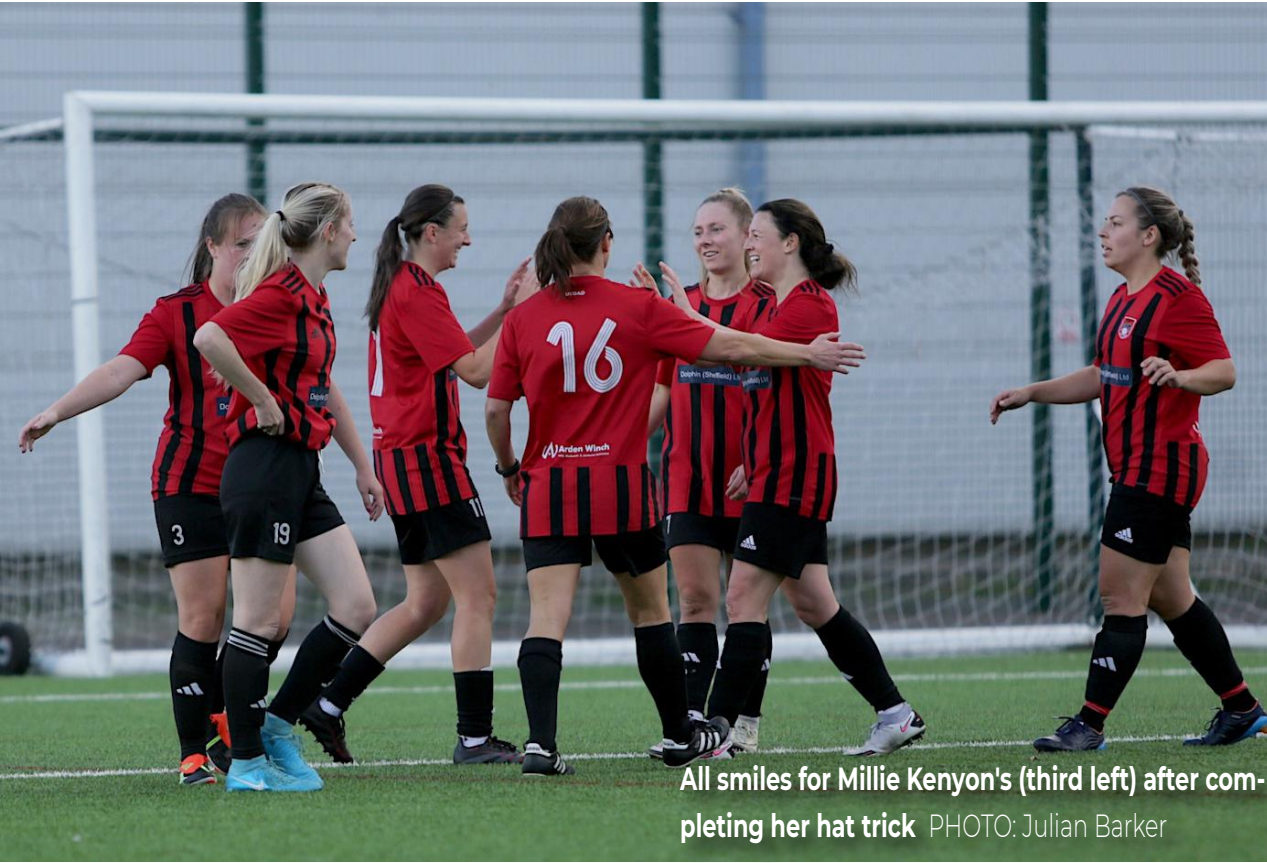

Sheffield Soak Rossendale in Seven-Try Rain Rampage!

Sheffield welcomed Rossendale RUFC, who were promoted to National 2 North from North West One at the end of last season having narrowly missed out to Macclesfield the previous season. Those with moderately long memories, will remember it was Rossendale we managed to narrowly defeat, 31-32, to get promotion to National League 2 North in the 2016-17 season.

In what can only be described as appalling torrential rain, Sheffield kicked off, playing toward the club house. Two quick consecutive penalties provided Sheffield with the opportunity to attack the visitors try line, and some smart interplay saw Chris ‘Dougal’ Hooper scamper over wide out on the left as the game moved through the second minute. Callum Posa added the conversion and the lead was 7 points to nil. Sheffield were soon on the attack

again, this time breaking out of their own half through Will Smith, who put Hooper off on another run, before handing off to Elliot Fisher, to score the second try for the home team, again out on the left, with just six minutes on the clock. Callum Posa converted again and the lead was out to 14 points to nil.

As we moved to the twenty-minute mark, Sheffield were awarded a penalty advantage just inside the Rossendale half. With play moving on down the right, the move broke down, leading to a loose pass to Josh Redfern, who had to turn backwards to take the pass, where he was ‘splatted’ with a tackle in to the kidneys, to lose the ball. One expected the referee to come back for the penalty, but no, he decided to say advantage over. Rossendale were able to hack the ball forward and their 18-year-old winger, Dan Holland to kick the ball on further and score under the post. Fullback, Lucas Atherton converted and Sheffield’s lead was somewhat contro-



versially reduced to 14 points to 7 after twenty minutes.

Some seven minutes later, Rossendale were reduced to fourteen players when loosehead prop forward, Brendan Berry, was shown a yellow card for a high tackle involving contact to the head. However, it was to be Rossendale who would add to their tally, when with thirty-five minutes on the clock, Sheffield were penalised out on the left and some thirty-five metres out, from which Lucas Atherton was able to add a further three points to take the score to 14 points to 10. Then with the game pushing hard toward half tie, Sheffield fashioned an attack down the right flank where winger Cameron Catleugh found just enough of a gap to squeeze through to score wide on the right. The conversion was missed, but Sheffield went in,

very wet, to half time leading by 19 points to 10.

Sheffield started the second half with renewed endeavour and were soon back on the hunt for points and tries. Sheffield had shown a very dominance in the scrums through the first half and this was immediately evident once more in the second half, and with barely five minutes gone, hooker Will Archer went over adjacent to the posts from a driving maul.

Callum Posa added the conversion and the lead was extended to 26 points to 10. Rossendale were then reduced to fourteen players again when scrum half, and captain, Callum Whelan, was to receive a yellow card on forty-eight minutes, again for a high tackle involving head contact. This was again going to be in Sheffield’s favour and they were soon back at the well when, winger Chris ‘Dougal’ Hooper went over for his second try and

Sheffield’s fifth, wide out in the left corner. The conversion was missed, but Sheffield’s lead was now 31 points to 10 after fifty-three minutes.

Sheffield’s dominance continued and they were to add further scores through Zak Poole, sixty-three minutes, and Jack Dawson, seventy-three minutes, both converted by Callum Posa, to take the final score to 45 points to 10, with seven tries bagged, with five conversions.

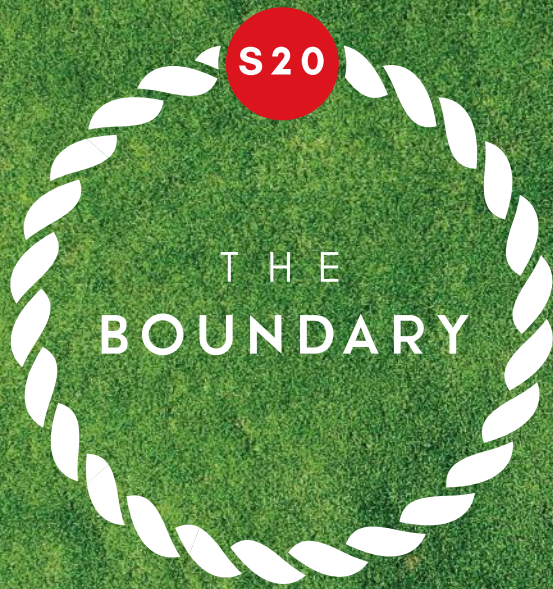
