Thank you to those Old Brentwoods, parents and friends who support the Foundation already: by doing so, you have contributed to a story that stretches back to the 16th Century and helped ensure it continues for many generations to come.

There are few things in our world that almost no-one disputes (perhaps even fewer today than ever before) but one of them is the widespread acceptance that education can transform lives. Few would argue against William Butler Yeats' statement that 'education is not the filling of a pail but the lighting of a fire' whilst almost everyone who works in schools can quickly cite specific examples of this aphorism and many like it.

One of the most important things we do at Brentwood is provide an outstanding and well rounded-education, excellent pastoral care and fantastic opportunities to children whose family and financial circumstances mean coming to our school would be impossible without significant – often full – financial assistance. Well over 100 children are in receipt of a means-tested bursary, of whom over 60 benefit from fully-funded places. Their individual stories are far more compelling than any statistical analysis could be, and I hope you will enjoy reading some of them in the pages that follow. This simply wouldn't be possible without the Brentwood School Foundation, which in turn relies on the help of friends and supporters from the wider community.

Brentwood School truly has a history of strong values; the 1622 statutes talk of virtue, learning and manners, and scholars freely receiving an education. These are values the School still honours today. Thank you to those Old Brentwoods, parents and friends who support the Foundation already: by doing so, you have contributed to a story that stretches back to the 16th Century and helped ensure it continues for many generations to come. The way we fund bursaries needs to change

The operational funds available to provide bursaries are likely to diminish with VAT, business rates and a climate of escalating costs of running a first-class independent school. The Foundation is the only way to continue building towards our goal of providing access to all children who would benefit, regardless of their background and financial means. Our focus is on transformative bursaries – those at 70% of fees or above – because without these awards it would simply never be an option for these students to attend Brentwood.

Where we are: Majority of bursaries are funded by the School.

129 Senior School bursaries

1622 Club

Connecting your donation to a bursary award

Joining the 1622 Club can take many forms, but all offer the opportunity for any individual or group to know their support is funding a full bursary place every year. We ask any 1622 Club donor to commit to at least two years of funding. However, the hope is that you or your group are able to make it an ongoing commitment with funding for a full place each year in perpetuity. This way the bursary can become an integral part of the School and Foundation.



The bursary will be formally awarded and renewed

each year using our rigorous selection process and you will be kept updated on the progress of your bursary student.

When funding a full bursary individually or as part of a group you have the opportunity to name the award. Examples of groups who may come together to fund a 1622 Club:

- A year group bursary
- An industry group award
- A bursary awarded by a small philanthropic group of individuals
- A bursary awarded in memory

Corporate Partnerships

Connecting your donation to a bursary award through your company





1662 Corporate Partnership is a commercial version of the Foundation's 1622 Club, allowing companies in the Brentwood School community to directly support the provision of a full bursary each academic year. This initiative has only just launched and we are proud to confirm Winged Boots as the first 1622 Corporate sponsor.

The 1622 route aims to fund a specific bursary, but every single pound donated to the Foundation is for the benefit of bursaries. We are very grateful to receive all donations because collectively it makes a huge difference. There are numerous routes to support in this way:

Regular gift

Setting up a direct debit or standing order is a great way to make a consistent gift for a sum affordable to you – these kinds of donations allow us to forecast Foundation income and allocate bursaries accordingly.

Single gift

We welcome specific donations via all mediums except cash. These are detailed on the donation form or via the QR code link above.

Gift aid

The School is a registered charity so if you are a UK taxpayer your donation may be increased by 25p for every £1 donated with no extra cost to you. If you are a higher tax rate payer you may also claim tax relief on your donation from the Inland Revenue. So please do include a declaration with any eligible gift.

Celebration and recognition

We are extremely grateful for all gifts made to the Foundation. For those that are able to offer more substantial gifts we are keen to recognise that generosity accordingly.

> £1,000	You will receive a letter of thanks from the Headmaster and a notation in our donor book.
> £20,000	Your name will be displayed in gold leaf on our Major Donor Board in the Headmaster's Reception.

These benchmarks are cumulative, so someone donating £50 a month would soon be noted in our donor book.

All our significant donors will also be invited to events throughout the year, where we celebrate the positive impact donor support has made to the lives of our bursary students.
