## Acknowledgement

Fresh Start Recovery is a nationally recognized organization that provides addiction treatment using an interdisciplinary approach based on individual needs. Our program recognizes addiction as a chronic brain disorder and empowers individuals to lead healthy and productive lives free from its adverse effects.

Our organization aligns with the philosophy that recovery is restoring an individual's sense of belonging through re-connection with self, others, and community. Fresh Start Recovery's comprehensive goal-setting strategy builds resiliency by developing social support systems within the individual's community. We also offer recreational and therapeutic activities in an atmosphere conducive to physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual growth.

Fresh Start Recovery's peer support model runs in unison with our treatment model of integrated chronic care, derived from the 12 Step abstinence model of recovery and underpinned by a biopsychosocial-spiritual model of therapy. Our diverse and eclectic staffing model boasts approximately three hundred years of combined lived experience, enabling us to bring forth a practical, empirically based approach to treatment.

Established in 1992 and now with locations in both Calgary and Lethbridge, Fresh Start has continued to provide solutions that recover lives by housing, treating, and supporting individuals affected by addiction. Our staff is integral to our success, offering insight, compassion, and understanding of addiction and recovery to help clients re-enter the Community.

Harley's ancestry is Blackfoot, and he has dedicated his career to serving First Nations communities in Alberta and British Columbia. During his more than 20 years of service with the RCMP, Harley held supervisory positions as a Detachment Commander in "K" (AB) and "E" (BC) Divisions. He went on to join the Aboriginal Policing Directorate as the Regional Manager, responsible for Alberta and Northwest Territories.

Harley's passion for Indigenous health and wellness led him to work for Alberta Health Services, where he served as the Indigenous Health Senior Advisor and the Indigenous Health Provincial Director. He is retired but continues to work part-time with Aakom-kiyii Health Service guiding their accreditation journey. He also sits on several committees, including the National Advisory Committee on Missing Children and Unmarked Burials.

Harley has received numerous awards for his contributions, including the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal, the Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of Canadian Confederation, and the 25-Year Service Award from Public Service Canada. He was also presented a Soapstone sculpture and Sacred Eagle Feather in recognition of his contributions to the First Nations people of Canada. Harley was inducted as an Honorary Chief of the Piikani (Blackfoot) Nation, including a traditional transfer of a sacred eagle headdress.

We are honoured to have Harley join our Board and look forward to his insights and the direction he will bring in providing hope, healing, and recovery to those struggling with addiction and mental health issues. Please join us in welcoming Harley to the Fresh Start Recovery community.

Housing is essential for every individual. As each embarks on rebuilding their lives, they must find stability and focus on growing. Through our Post-Treatment housing initiatives, individuals receive ongoing support and guidance to facilitate their integration into the community. Supported living arrangements are crucial in ensuring long-term recovery and reducing the risk of relapse.

Recognizing the immediate need for accessible post-treatment housing, community partners in Lethbridge joined forces to provide support for recovering individuals. These partnerships have been instrumental in creating a safe, stable, and sober environment that fosters a sense of security and belonging. We know this as our 46 post-treatment beds in Calgary are always occupied. We have established a continuum that provides the necessary structure and resources, including access to counselling, peer support, and assistance in securing employment and education opportunities while providing a strong sense of independence.

Fresh Start Recovery understands and recognizes that the growing number of Program alumni has increased the demand for post-treatment housing facilities. Organizations and individuals have continued to collaborate with our organization to expand the availability of beds creating and providing additional options to accommodate the rising number of individuals requiring the continued support of post-treatment housing.

By investing in and expanding posttreatment housing resources, we contribute to the overall well-being of individuals and promote healthier, more resilient communities better equipped to tackle the challenges of recovery.




## Supporting

Physical activity plays a crucial role in recovery, providing numerous physical, mental, and emotional benefits to those who engage in it. Incorporating various activities such as power hour sessions from Mission Fitness, yoga, meditation, volleyball, basketball, and floor hockey, our program helps individuals to improve their overall well-being and build resilience against relapse. Exercise has been scientifically proven to reduce stress, anxiety, and depression, common triggers for substance abuse. Furthermore, engaging in physical activities fosters a sense of accomplishment and self-efficacy, empowering individuals to believe in their ability to maintain sobriety.

In addition to improving physical health, our diverse range of activities promotes social connections and camaraderie among participants. By participating in team sports, individuals learn essential life skills such as teamwork, communication, and conflict resolution, which are vital in their journey toward recovery. Clients build their physical strength virtually and in person through daily Power Hour, and the program is designed so that they can continue at home with the equipment readily available in their house. Client's physical limitations are also kept in mind with lighter activity or time to further their recovery assessed case by case. Activities like yoga and meditation cultivate mindfulness and self-awareness, enabling individuals to develop better-coping strategies and emotional regulation.

Through these varied activities, our program holistically addresses the complex needs of those recovering from addiction, providing them with the tools and support necessary to achieve lasting recovery and a healthy, fulfilling life.

To address this, our Outreach team supports all life areas and support through continued check-ins and peer mentoring.

In conjunction with our extensive services, Fresh Start presents a six-week relapse prevention course and a life skills program at our facility for those looking to enhance their recovery journey. We recognize that finishing treatment is not the ultimate objective; instead, it marks the commencement of a lifelong dedication to sobriety, happiness, and hope resulting in a higher quality of life.

With the rental market's record highs, affordable sober living is crucial to the success of those we serve. Our Outreach Department oversees our post-treatment housing and conducts weekly check-ins with clients to support their ongoing journey toward sobriety. Through our own post-treatment housing and community partnerships, we assist as many alumni and their families as possible.

Over the last year, we have had substantial growth in our Outreach team, expanding from four to six dedicated individuals. This advance was integral in our ability to support the continued growth of our alumni and organization. We have also started preparing for the completion of an enhanced outreach program in 2023. Our community's remarkable support, your donations and the Government's commitment have made this program and expansion possible. Our objective is to foster a lasting recovery in our clients through our continuum of care, and this expansion will serve as a vital bridge in our mission.





#### **Events**



Over the past year, Fresh Start Recovery has made significant strides in expanding our presence in Alberta, further strengthening our position as a leader in the recovery community. By increasing our unity and community engagement, Fresh Start has better supported those in recovery and their families.

#### Reunited

Ron K, a Fresh Start alumnus, offers an inspiring recovery story after being referred to us through N.W.T. His struggle began at 13, and though he sought help at multiple treatment centers, sobriety eluded him. In 2016, he came to Fresh Start for the first time and returned in 2020 with the willingness to push forward and take the suggestions from our program and implement them into his life. Upon completing phase one treatment, he moved into Fresh Start's post-treatment housing in Calgary.

Ron learned, adapted, and leaned on his support despite an initial relapse. He joined the Alumni Association, maintained contact with his sponsor, and continued living in our post-treatment housing. Today, he has over two years of continuous sobriety. Ron has also transformed his personal life, reconnecting with his 13-year-old son, who lives with him full-time. He values his connections within the community and credits Fresh Start with equipping him with the tools for an alcohol-free life.

Ron knows he can lean on his supportive community. Fresh Start and the posttreatment housing program have empowered him to maintain his sobriety and build a new, healthier life. We're proud of Ron's achievements and honoured to share his story.

Allanah A's journey is a testament to the power of resilience and determination. Hailing from Lethbridge, she turned to Fresh Start Recovery for support in her battle against addiction.

Her commitment to recovery was immediately evident. She embraced service work early, becoming a support for new program clients. This fortified her recovery and served as a beacon of hope for others. Post-treatment, Allanah remains an active member of the Alumni Association and the Lethbridge recovery community, choosing to stay close to her roots and family.

Her journey is a shining example of the transformative power of recovery, underscoring the possibilities of a purpose-driven life in sobriety. Currently, Allanah holds a service position as one of the birthday chairs within the Alumni Association and lives in post-treatment housing. She has secured employment, contributes to the community, and is present in the relationships in her life today.

Katie and her brother Rob are alumni of our organization, and their grandparents founded Fresh Start Recovery.

Fresh Start salutes the vision and commitment of the Berthelotte family and individuals like Katie, who help transform lives and inspire hope. Katie is employed part-time as a CSW with Fresh Start Recovery. She and her partner are enjoying life while raising their children.

Dave P. has been on a long journey to sobriety, engaging in the recovery community since 2007. Despite initial relapses after short-term treatment at other treatment facilities, he achieved eight years of sobriety through 12-step meetings and service work. Unfortunately, as he explains, complacency led to his drift from these supports, resulting in his relapse.

In 2021, Dave turned to Fresh Start. Since joining, he has marked two years of uninterrupted recovery, crediting the supportive community at Fresh Start for his progress. Now residing at our post-treatment housing, Dave contributes to the community by maintaining the surroundings and participating in our many events.

At 57, Dave's determination to aid others is undiminished. Looking forward, Dave aims to strengthen ties with his six sisters and continue working full-time. He is also a part-time CSW at Fresh Start and plans to enroll in a Social Worker diploma program at Bow Valley College in September.

Despite past struggles, Dave has found solace in his post-treatment housing, cherishing the connections with his fellow alumni. He views it as a sanctuary, a haven offering invaluable support on his path to recovery.

### Family Healing Alumni

"I completed the family healing program in 2020 where I, for the first time, felt as though my chaotic life was understood and I was able to begin to address it in a safe environment. It was a space I could be vulnerable enough to address my own hurts and fears. The family healing program was the beginning of a walk towards finding my own peace and tools to living in a way that was conducive to personal healing and growth. After the Family Healing Program I began attending the Family Healing Program Alumni meetings on Thursday evenings weekly. I became a part of an "extended family" based on trust, understanding and a mutual desire in the pursuit of serenity (regardless if our addicted loved one(s) were in recovery or not). The Family Healing Alumni share in a mutual experience where our lives became unglued by the impact of a loved one's addiction and this mutual experience allows for an understanding that I needed for my own healing. The group became one of the greatest supports in my life today. The impact of having this support has allowed me to work towards living in an authentic way of compassion, self-respect and to be reflective of my own choices in a kind way. We share a mutual goal; although most of us maintain our desire to see our addicted loved one(s) live in recovery, we also desire and now strive to live a life with peace, restful sleep and wholeness so that we are also able to walk out in our fullness each day."



#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Directors of Fresh Start Recovery Centre

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Fresh Start Recovery Centre (the organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2022, and the statements of revenues and expenditures, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the organization as at December 31, 2022, and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNPO)

#### Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the organization in accordance with ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with ASNPO, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the organization's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the organization to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.


Fresh Start Funding Sources- 2022


