History OF THE BLACK ANTHEM

Often referred to as "The Black National Anthem," Lift Every Voice and Sing was a hymn written as a poem by NAACP leader James Weldon Johnson in 1900. His brother, John Rosamond Johnson (1873-1954), composed the music for the lyrics. A choir of 500 schoolchildren at the segregated Stanton School, where James Weldon Johnson was principal, first performed the song in public in Jacksonville, Florida to celebrate President Abraham Lincoln's birthday.

At the turn of the 20th century,
Johnson's lyrics eloquently captured
the solemn yet hopeful appeal for
the liberty of Black Americans. Set
against the religious invocation of
God and the promise of freedom, the
song was later adopted by NAACP
and prominently used as a rallying cry
during the Civil Rights Movement of
the 1950s and1960s.

Throughout the sixties, a number of initiatives to bring a Hampton Roads affiliate of the Urban League failed. Then, as it remains, the need for an Urban League affiliate was evidenced by poverty rates and the wealth gap: low educational attainment and high unemployment. For example, during this period while Black families made up 29% of the total population, they made up 47% of the poorest segment and 50% of black families lived below the poverty line. Unemployment for Black youth exceeded 40%, and 38% of all unemployed were Black males. Median years of education for blacks was 9.3 years compared to a white rate of 11.8 years.

While the need for a service agency focused on this population cohort was clear, there was hogh reluctance and lack of support to start the affiliate. Despite the unwillingness to form a league, as early as the 1970's, a racially diverse group would gather on Saturday mornings at the Giant Open air market at Wards Corner in Norfolk to discuss issues pertinent to improving the plight of minorities in the area. The group

included prominent whites and blacks as well as media persons. However, it was understood that they were not to publicize the meetings.

Efforts continued and Dr. and Mrs J. O. Willie engaged with Mrs. Vivian Mason and Dr. Lyman Brooks, President Emeritus of Norfolk State University. With the help of Father Joseph Green, the first organizational meeting was held at Grace Episcopal Church in Norfolk in July 1977. Sensing momentum, representatives from area businesses, civic leagues, and the educational system gathered to explore the possibility of forming an affiliate. Dr Harrison Wilson, President of Norfolk State University, presided over the meeting.

It was determined that the Urban League of Tidewater would be an interracial, non-profit organization that would work towards the same various goals of equality that the current Urban League of Hampton Roads aspires to...equality in housing, health, education and workforce outcomes.

Reynote SPEAKER

DR. SARAH LEWIS

FOUNDER, PROFESSOR, AUTHOR



Sarah is the founder of Vision & Justice; a catalytic civic initiative that reveals the foundational role visual culture plays in generating equity and justice in America. At Harvard, she pioneered the course Vision and Justice: The Art of Race and American Citizenship, which she continues to teach, and which is now part of the university's core curriculum.

Her latest book, The Unseen Truth (an Amazon bestseller), reveals one of the greatest lies we've been told about race in this country, and how we can move past it. She tells the story of the Caucasian war—the fight for independence in the Caucasus that coincided with the end of the U.S. Civil War—and how it showed that the place from which we derive "Caucasian" for whiteness actually wasn't white at all. She shows how visual tactics concealed the truth in order to secure our regime of racial injustice, and how we can begin to see what we have ignored and start to dismantle this regime. Harvard professor Imani Perry says that she "illuminates what it means to both 'see' and create race, deepening our ability to pursue justice."

She is also the bestselling author of The Rise: Creativity, the Gift of Failure, and the Search for Mastery, a story-driven investigation into a biography of an idea—a big idea—that no current term yet captures. It reveals the secrets behind creative human endeavor, and how innovation, mastery, and new concepts are found in unlikely places. The New York Times writes that "Lewis's voice is so lyrical and engaging that her book, The Rise, can be read in one sitting," while Junot Diaz praises it as "exhilarating, inspiring, profound and so beautifully written it left me breathless." It has been translated into six languages to date.

Sarah's talks urgently address the world we are living in right now, gathering various threads—art history, technical innovation, race, photography, the story of America, and her own deeply personal narrative—to elucidate the power of art to ignite transformative social change. This combination

of urgency, hope, and clear, compelling analysis keeps her lecture halls packed; it's the reason her award-winning "Vision and Justice" issue of Aperture Magazine (now in its fourth printing) and bestselling book The Unseen Truth have garnered unprecedented press coverage and changed the national conversation on race. Clint Smith, #1 New York Times bestselling author of How the Word Is Passed, says that "it is almost as if Sarah Lewis has given us a new pair of glasses that allow us to see history in ways that were previously unclear. Lewis has provided us with an indispensable resource to better see ourselves."

Sarah has spoken to top-tier organizations from Prada to ABC to United Way. Her mainstage TED talk received over 2.8 million views and she was a closing speaker at SXSW. She was prominently featured in HBO's Black Art: In the Absence of Light, a "rich and absorbing" documentary exploring two centuries of art by African-Americans, and the path they forged for contemporary Black artists. Sarah's scholarship has also been profiled by The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, and The Boston Globe, to name a few. She was on Oprah's "Power List," served on President Obama's Arts Policy Committee, and was the inaugural recipient of the Freedom Scholar Award, presented by The Association for the Study of African American Life and History. The award honors Lewis for her body of work and its "direct positive impact on the life of African-Americans."

An associate professor at Harvard University in the Department of History of Art and Architecture and the Department of African and African American Studies, Sarah focuses on the intersection of African American and Black Atlantic visual representation, racial justice, and representational democracy in the United States. Her forthcoming publications include Vision & Justice (One World/Random House, Fall 2025), and Groundwork: Race and Aesthetics in the Era of Stand Your Ground Law.

TIM REID, Emmy-nominated actor, director and producer, has appeared on television for over three decades, from Venus Flytrap, on WKRP in Cincinnati through Simon & Simon, Frank's Place, Sister, Sister, That 70's Show, HBO's Treme, and recently OWN's Love Is, and Greenleaf.


He made his directorial debut with his critically acclaimed feature film, "Once Upon a Time... When We Were Colored." Tim's other film projects include "Asunder," starring Blair Underwood, Debbi Morgan and Michael Beach, and "For Real", which Reid directed, and produced. He co-produced, with Atlantis Films Limited, "Race to Freedom: The Underground Railroad." The film starring Courtney Vance was nominated for Cable Ace Awards' Best Picture. Tim executive produced the critically acclaimed CBS movie "About Sarah," starring Mary Steenburgen, Kellie Martin, and Diane Baker for which he received a Christopher Award. He also created and produced the acclaimed Showtime TV series "Linc's", and has received the "Oscar Micheaux Award" from the Producer's Guild of America for outstanding lifetime achievement.

In 2012, Reid co-produced and directed "Keepers of the Flame", a film of Virginia's central role in American history, which runs in the visitors center of the Virginia State Capitol. He recently launched

the TV series, Legacy of a People, descripted as a "Talkumentary," Through his non-profit Legacy Media Institute, he instructs an international group of students and emerging filmmakers, promoting excellence and accountability in creating media that reflects a diverse global society.

Reid has received numerous Honorary Degrees and has been inducted into the National Black College Hall of Fame. He was appointed by two Governors to serve two terms on the Board of Visitors of Norfolk State University, and he served on the prestigious Richmond Forum Board.

Tim recently launched an international streaming

DR. SCOTT MILLER
President, Virginia Wesleyan University

Dr. Scott D. Miller is President of Virginia Wesleyan University in Virginia Beach, Virginia. In his 10th year at VWU and his 34th year as a college president, Dr. Miller is one of the most experienced and prominent liberal arts college leaders in America. Recognized by numerous books and publications nationally for his transformative leadership style, he was identified in the book The Entrepreneurial College President as one of 17 most entrepreneurial presidents in American higher education. Virginia Wesleyan has enjoyed significant growth, development and accolades during Dr. Miller's tenure. Accomplishments include transitioning to university status; establishment of the highly selective endowed Batten Honors College, a graduate program, and VWU Online; 22 new construction projects on campus and capital

improvements of over \$135 million; the addition of a campus in Tokyo, Japan in partnership with Lakeland University Japan (VWU Global); and increasing the endowment from \$53 million in 2015 to \$130 million in 2024, concluding Virginia Wesleyan's largest fundraising campaign in history. Under his leadership, the University has received over \$13 million in grants to support student scholarships and success for underserved populations, including a federal Title III grant and a National Science Foundation grant. Also during that time, the University became an inaugural member of the Liberal Arts Colleges Racial Equity Leadership Alliance (LACRELA) in 2020. In 2019, Dr. Miller appointed the University's first Chief Diversity Officer and has promoted an expanding menu of campus programming discussing and celebrating inclusion and diversity through the VWU Robert Nusbaum Center. He earned his B.A. in communications from West Virginia Wesleyan College, worked as a journalist early in his career, and completed an M.A. from the University of Dayton. He earned an Ed.S. from Vanderbilt University and a Ph.D. from The Union Institute and University . Dr. Miller has been married for 41 years to Annie Cook Miller. They have two adult daughters and four grandchildren
