## ALMIGHTY ALLAH





Note: The content of this book is based on the Qur'an, Hadith, and Islamic texts that have been written, verified, and approved by three scholars.

Allah is the Creator of the heavens, the Earth, and everything between them. He created the entire world and everything it contains on land, in the air, and in the water. Allah says, "It is Allah who created the heavens and the earth and whatever is between them in six days..." [The Qur'an: 32:4].



Allah causes rain to fall and the earth to grow crops and fruits for us. Allah says, "It is He Who sends down water from the sky, and with it, we bring forth vegetation of all kinds, and out of it We bring forth green stalks, from which We bring forth thick clustered grain." [The Qur'an: 6:99].



Allah makes the sun rise and set, replacing the light of day with the darkness of night, so His servants can toil the earth for provision during the day and sleep for rest at night.



Allah is One in Lordship without a partner. He is the First, with no one before Him, and the Last, with no one after Him. Only He will remain when all else perishes.



Allah created life and death. He causes His creatures to die and rise again, and unto Him is the final return. [The Qur'an: 57:2].



Allah created seven heavens and adorned the lowest heaven with stars and the moon, which guides us with their light on dark nights. Allah says, "And We have certainly beautified the nearest heaven with lamps [i.e., stars]..." [The Qur'an: 67:5].



Allah is the Most High; nothing is above Him, and He is the nearest, for nothing is nearer than Him. The Prophet said, "You are the Most High and there is nothing above You..."



Allah has knowledge of all things: what has happened, what will happen, and what hasn't happened. He knows the outcomes if they were to occur. He is aware of the unseen and the evident, and nothing escapes His awareness.



As Allah mentions in Surah Al-Hadid, verse 4, "He knows what penetrates into the earth and what emerges from it and what descends from the heaven and what ascends therein; and He is with you wherever you are. And Allah, of what you do, is Seeing."



Allah is the King of the heavens and the earth. To Him ascend all matters for decision, and He sets the course of nature in a manner that reflects His wisdom. Through His decree, everything follows its course in justice and fairness.



Allah is the Most Wise. He brings forth good and permits evil due to His boundless knowledge and wisdom, and He is never unjust to any of His creations. In everything He permits and withholds, there is goodness and a firm purpose.



Allah is the Just and the Judge. He settles disputes, assigns punishments, and pardons wrongdoing. Indeed, He observes everything. Not a single injustice escapes His notice, and He will surely hold all accountable for their deeds.



Allah is the Oft-Forgiving, the Pardoner. He loves to forgive and pardon His repentant servants. No matter how great the sins are or how often they are committed, He is always eager to forgive and pardon those who repent sincerely to Him.



Allah is the Opener, the Self-Sufficient, and the Bestower of Grace. He needs no one, yet all His creatures depend on Him. He opens the door of His mercy to whom He wills and bestows His bounties on whom He wills.



Allah is the Most Generous. He gives without measure in a manner that satisfies His servants. Allah says, "...And Allah provides for those whom He wills, without measure,"

[The Qur'an: 24:38].



Allah is the Guide, the One who leads His creatures from darkness into light. Whomever He guides, none can mislead, and He is never unjust to any of His creatures.



Allah does whatever He likes. He is not accountable to anyone, yet all creatures are accountable to Him. He takes detailed account of every matter and calls to account whom He wills.



Allah loves to be called by His names. He has the most beautiful names and answers supplications when His names are used in beseeching Him. As Allah says in the Qur'an, "The **Most Beautiful Names belong** to Allah, so call on Him by them." [The Qur'an: 7:180].



Allah is He Who deserves to be feared. Although He is Most Merciful to His obedient servants, He is also severe in punishment for disbelievers and those who transgress His limits.




