Then and Now: St. Patrick's Day Parade

Chicago is famous for its spirited celebration of St. Patrick's Day. Every March the city dyes the Chicago River green and holds not one but two parades in honor of Chicago's Irish heritage.

But in 1949, neither the Chicago St.
Patrick's Day Parade nor the South Side
Irish Parade had been christened, and the
city's Irish community relied on smaller
neighborhood gatherings to celebrate the
holiday. This photo from the March 24,
1949, issue of The Garfieldian—a
newspaper published in Garfield Park—
shows one such celebration among
workers at a Chicago Transit Authority
maintenance shop. While the popular
parade and large-scale festivities we know
today were still years in the making, the

seeds of our current citywide celebrations were already being sown at shindigs like these. As the Garfieldian noted, workers from "Poland, Italy, Scotland and Jerusalem" joined their Irish colleagues for this impromptu parade.

Now in its 69th year, the Chicago St. Patrick's Day Parade has become one of the city's defining traditions, accompanied by the dyeing of the river by the Chicago Journeymen

Plumbers Local Union 130. The downtown procession is one of Chicago's two annual St. Patrick's Day celebrations. Along with the South Side Irish Parade, both trace their roots back to the same place. The original South Side Irish Parade (known at the time as the Southtown Parade) was first held on March 15, 1953, along 79th Street. It lasted for seven years before Mayor Richard J. Daley combined the Southtown and West Side St. Patrick's Day parades and moved the march to the

March is Red Cross Month

Cross Organization

Red Cross is a non-profit organization that steps in to help those in need during and after some type of crisis. However, they also work hard to provide individuals with information for them to prepare themselves for a disaster. Educating the public about storing emergency survival kits is an essential part of their work. It isn't always possible for emergency assistance to respond immediately.

The Red Cross is continually in need of funding and supplies to keep their operations going. They often need assistance to replenish the items they give out to people during their time of need. You can make a cash donation to your local Red Cross organization that is tax deductible. It can be any amount you are able to assist them with based on your own budget. You can also donate supplies they may need including clothing, toys, radios, flashlights, phone cards, and vehicles.

Household goods and items are often needed at your local Red Cross as well. Furniture including items for babies, tables and chairs, and beds are all frequently asked for by those in need. Anything that falls into this category that is in good condition can be donated and is also usable as an income tax write off.

You can volunteer your time to your local Red Cross as well. More than 95% of their help is on a volunteer basis. You won't be under any obligation to give any specific amount of time. They often have various activities they need assistance with including food and clothing drives. More volunteers are needed during crisis situations, but there are always plenty of ongoing activities to help with regularly if you are available.

Donating blood is a great way to help your local Red Cross. They generally have blood drives on certain days of the month so contact them to find out the schedule. Blood is often in need during a crisis, and the Red Cross works hard to keep a good supply of it rather than just collecting it at the time of desperate

During natural disasters such as Hurricane Katrina, the local Red Cross organizations helped get families reunited with each other. Not knowing where their loved ones were located was a considerable burden to many families. Having a centralized system where people can register to be found or to find others is very important.

Being a local advocate for the Red Cross is essential because people are more willing to donate their time. money, and goods to an organization if they are aware of what services they provide. You can also advocate for those in need to contact the Red Cross to see if they can assist them with some of their basic needs.

Another great way to help your local Red Cross organization is to pay attention to those that may be frauding the system. During times of need, there will be scammers that try to get a piece of the assistance being offered. This takes away valuable resources from those that really need it to be available to them. Report any suspicions to your local Red Cross or to local law enforcement agencies.

PEANUT BUTTER: THINK OUTSIDE THE SANDWICH

Peanut butter has been a pantry and sandwich staple in households for generations. However, this beloved American icon is more than a spread destined to partner with jelly. Peanut butter is also a nutrient dense food that is sometimes overlooked as part of a healthy lifestyle. Incorporating peanut butter into a variety of dishes and snacks can help add essential nutrients to one's diet.

One serving of peanut butter (just two tablespoons) provides eight grams of protein, two grams of fiber, 10 percent of the Reference Daily Intake (RDI) of vitamin E and 12 percent of the RDI of magnesium. Additionally, the USDA's MyPyramid recognizes the importance of varying dietary protein sources and suggests that peanut butter, along with nuts and other nut butters, may be substituted for meat or poultry in meals. Additionally, peanut butter is cholesterol free and contains zero grams of trans-fats per serving.

A walk down the grocery store aisle reveals a wide selection of peanut butters to meet different tastes and dietary needs. Creamy, crunchy or with a touch of honey, Smucker's Natural Peanut Butter and Jif Peanut Butter brands offer an assortment of choices, including lower salt and reduced fat varieties.

Think outside the sandwich and spread peanut butter on apple slices for a delicious snack. Put a dollop in yogurt or even stir into hot oatmeal. Peanut butter can also be the basis of sauces that can turn plain noodles or chicken into a delightfully exotic dish as in this recipe for Asian Noodles with Chili-

ASIAN NOODLES WITH CHILI-NUT SAUCE

- 3 tablespoons Smucker's Natural Chunky Peanut Butter, Jif Extra Crunchy or Simply Jif Peanut
- ▶ 1/4 cup reduced-sodium soy sauce
- ▶ 1-2 tablespoons Chinese chili oil
- 1/4 cup rice vinegar
- 2 tablespoons dark brown sugar
- 1 (10 ounce) package Chinese wheat noodles or 1/2-pound package whole wheat spaghetti, cooked according to package
- ▶ 4 green onions, sliced diagonally into 1/4-inch slices
- ▶ 1/2 cup chopped red bell pepper
- > Toasted sesame seeds for garnish

Combine peanut butter, soy sauce, chili oil, rice vinegar and brown sugar in a large bowl. Stir to blend well. Toss drained noodles with chili-nut sauce, onions, and peppers. Cool noodles to room temperature. To serve, place noodles on a serving platter, garnish with sesame seeds. For a variation, add 2 cups chopped cooked chicken.


