

# Message from our Co-Presidents

As we celebrate sporting wins, bask in the excitement on the fields and courts, and continue to drive new programs and initiatives, we are mindful of the growing rise of antisemitism around the globe, and always keep a place in our thoughts and hearts for our brethren in Israel.

With that in mind, we have placed an extra focus on safety and security, working closely with CSG and our clubs to ensure that all Maccabi members have a safe place to play sport. January saw almost 200 young Team Vic athletes connecting at Junior Carnival in Sydney, as part of the biggest national Carnival we've seen in many years. With the support of team managers, youth leaders, and volunteers, over 400 young Jews from across Australia played sport, socialised, and enjoyed everything Sydney had on offer. Preparations are already well underway for Carni 2025 in Perth.

This year has also seen the introduction of the Solomon Family Maccabi Interschool Cup. Our inaugural event saw eight teams of grade 5/6 basketballers from four of our Jewish schools come together for a nail-biting morning of competition. Watching the students, teachers, and families come together to share in the excitement was so special. We already have six schools on board for our upcoming secondary school soccer comp and we look forward to seeing if Bialik will defend their title.

We recently marked National Volunteer Week by surprising volunteers across our clubs at trainings, meetings, and games. On behalf of the Maccabi Victoria Board, we want to thank everyone who gives their time to ensure that our Jewish community stays connected through sport each and every week.

As we look to the second half of the year, we are excited to see more sporting opportunities, to build more community connections, and to share in many more amazing Maccabi memories.



In 2024, Maccabi Victoria launched the **Maccabi Cup**. Providing interschool sport competition for our Jewish schools, it was a welcome addition to the calendar.

The first Maccabi Cup event saw **Grade 5** and 6 students from Bialik College, King David School, Mount Scopus Memorial College, and Leibler Yavneh College competing in a friendly yet spirited basketball tournament.

**Bialik** were declared the overall winners, and we are eager to see if they will defend their title in the upcoming year 8/9 soccer competition, to be held in September.

## **Pathways in Schools**

The Henry Jolson Pathways Program bridges the gap between Maccabi clubs and Jewish day schools, providing children from prep to year 12 with opportunities to participate in and learn new sports through subsidised specialised coaching.

Martin Jona has led the Henry Jolson Pathways School Program for the past five years, during which participant numbers have grown by 131%. Since February 2019, prep to year 12 students across 8 Jewish schools have enjoyed sessions in 14 different sports.
