Showing Up How does OSLC really show up?

By now you have probably heard something about the book, Showing Up, A Comprehensive Guide to Comfort and Connection, wonderfully written by our neighbor, Jen Marr.

Members who have been at Our Savior's for a while will resoundingly tell you this community is great at loving and supporting one another. We strive to be a welcoming community that sticks together through thick and thin.

So how are we doing?

Did we ever measure if we really are good at showing up to transform lives with the love of Christ?

We hadn't.

In January, we boldly embarked on the Showing Up journey to see how we stack up. In worship and online, we launched the congregation survey. Our goal was 100 responses, and we received an astounding 217 survey responses ranging across all ages:


- 56% over age 55
- 22% ages 35-55
- 8% ages 18-35
- 14% 14-17

And we heard not only from our church family but also from visitors.

We rate ourselves very high on the empathy/compassion scale 95%, and we are very compassionate. That is true.

Yet 62% of our members feel unseen in their struggles. We have a 33% gap—if we are so good at being empathetic, why don't we ourselves feel seen? We need to truly see those in need of support. But when we are experiencing our own challenges, we also need to open up and share our struggles with our circle of close friends and family. Shockingly, only 32% feel able to ask for support when they need it.

Another big wow: 63% wish they could be more open with others. What does that say about our community? Our personalities? How can this be happening here? What can we do to improve both our ability to see others when they struggle and be more open when we, ourselves, need help?





So, what is Showing Up?

We know that we have a mental health crisis in our country. Look at the statistics:

- 61% of adults aged 18 25 in the US report feeling lonely frequently or all the time
- 40 million adults in the US have an anxiety disorder (19% of the population)
- 26% of adults in the US suffer from a diagnosable mental illness
- 61% of young people ages 18-25 in the US report feeling lonely frequently or all the time

When we think about mental health, our regular way of thinking is that there are two kinds of help. There is clinical care such as therapists, counselors, social workers, doctors, and professionals in the field of mental health. These are the trained clinicians who provide treatment and strategies to move forward to those suffering emotionally.

The other option is self-care. This is self-regulation, mindfulness, inner work, and taking care of oneself. Both are very critical frameworks. It's like a barbell - One on each end. What's the problem? If you're in the gym and you are struggling, that barbell is very heavy to lift on your own. We put the burden on the individual to find care and support themselves and be self-sufficient. It's all up to you to figure out your own care, to initiate it, to pay for it, to organize it, etc. all while you are at less capacity. We aren't wired that way.

The middle is where "Showing Up" comes in. We develop supportive care networks with our family and close friends. Supportive care is what lifts-up the barbell and lets us know we don't have to go through this alone. We want to equip our church family with the tools to showing up for one another and provide the transformational care God calls us to do. We are God's hands, feet, eyes and ears on our earthly journey. The book study and workshops fill our toolbox with a practical, easy to follow, step by step process to care for those we love and deeply care for. This process doesn't fix it, but says, "I've got your back. I see you. You're not in this alone." We give you not only what to say and do, but also what to say and many, many ways you do the work God calls this congregation to do.


