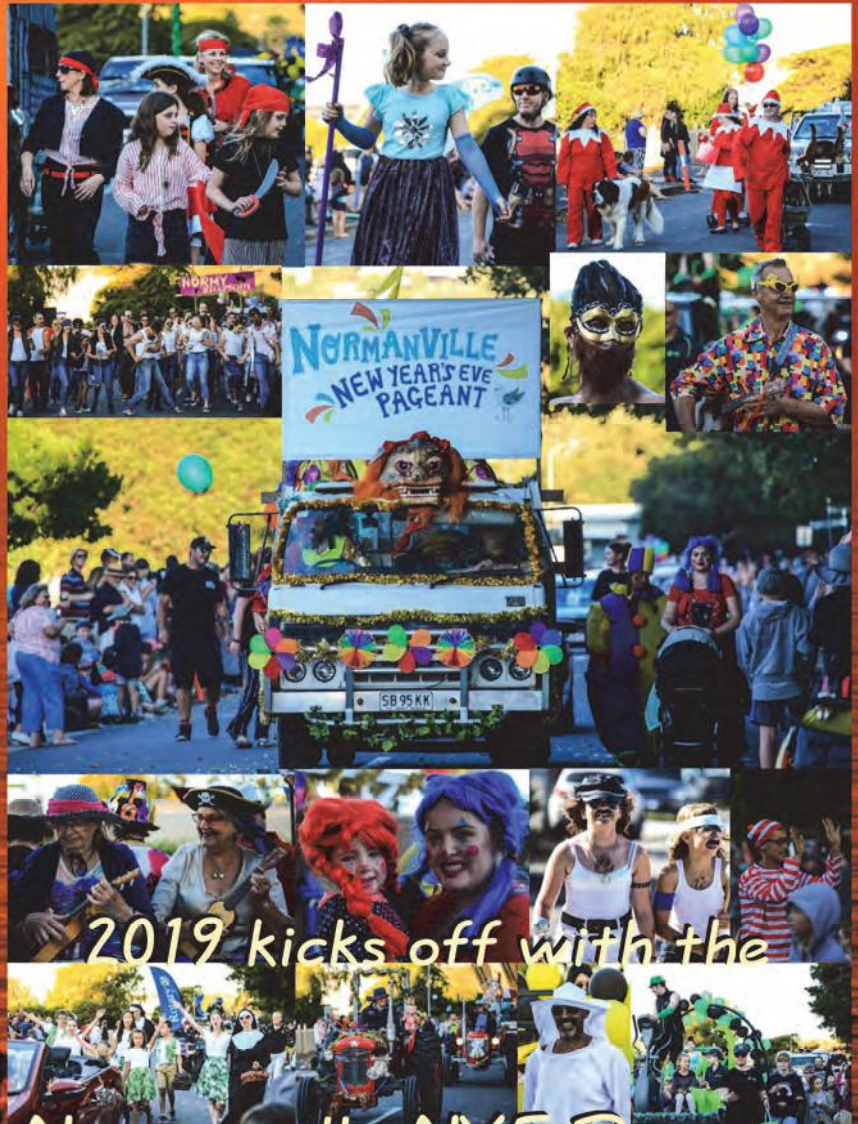

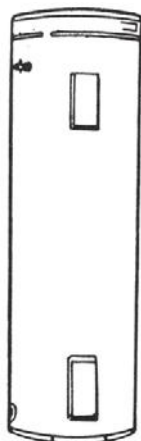

Art Exhibition at Allusion Winery

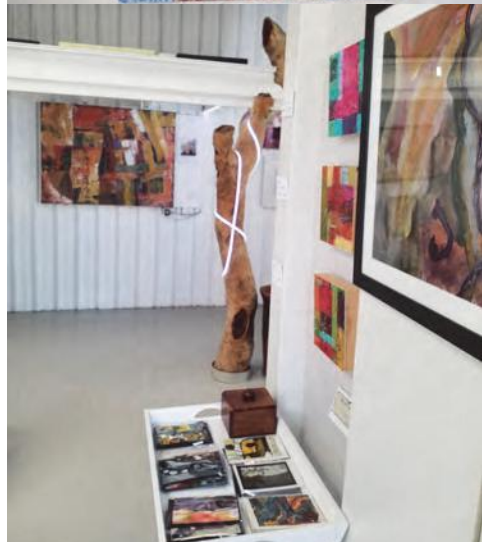

**Headspace Funding
Boost A Win For
MAYO Youth**

The Federal Government's \$3 million funding injection into 'headspace' mental health services at Mount Barker and Victor Harbor over the next four years is just what the doctor ordered for the young people of Mayo, according to local MP Rebekha Sharkie.

Health Minister Greg Hunt on 16 December announced that \$800,000 would be shared between the two regional centres this financial year to expand and set up satellite services. From 2019-20, a total of \$760,000 a year (\$380 000 each) for three years



would be provided to operate these two services.

"I think it's fantastic that the Minister has acted on the concerns raised by our community," Federal Member for Mayo Rebekha Sharkie said.

"This announcement means more young people will get the support they need, it means the expanded Mount Barker 'headspace' is better able to meet the ever-growing demand for its services and young people on the South

Coast have much better access to youth-specific services than they ever had in the past.

"'headspace' has outgrown their current premises in Mount Barker so we know the demand is there.

"This funding commitment to expand services in Mount Barker and Victor Harbor means more young people can reach out and get the advice and assistance they need, including more complex care.

"Through my office's dealings with health groups, we know that one in five young people in Australia suffers from a serious mental illness, that suicide is the leading cause of death for young people and that for every young person who takes their own life there are up to 200 suicide attempts. "Even during the recent by-election, our community raised preventative and acute mental health services for young people as a priority issue and I

» pledged to act on their behalf.
"I appreciate Minister Hunt's open door policy towards discussing the health needs of our community."

'headspace' is a specialist early intervention mental health service for young people aged 12 to 25 years.

Rebekha's youth advisory group, Young Mayo, began campaigning for a full 'headspace' centre in the Hills in early 2017.

The group collected nearly 500 signatures for a petition calling for a 'headspace' service which Rebekha presented to the Parliament.

Funding for a full centre wasn't allocated but the Country Primary Health Network (PHN) was able to provide funding for the Murray Bridge 'headspace' to officially open an outreach service in Mount Barker in late 2017.

"Since then the demand for a 'headspace' service has grown in our region, which everyone involved in youth mental health knew would be the

case, so the Government's funding injection is wonderful news," Rebekha said.

PHN will be the group managing the extra funding for the Mount Barker and Victor Harbor 'headspace' satellite services.

The expanded services are expected to open within 12 months.

Sharkie Opens South Coast Office

Federal Member for Mayo Rebekha Sharkie now has a permanent presence on the South Coast after she opened an office at Victor Harbor in mid-December.

The satellite electorate office is located at 22 Hindmarsh Road, McCracken, and is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9am to 5pm.

"I have always believed that Mayo constituents needed a more accessible office on the Fleurieu," Rebekha said "Unfortunately the Australian Electoral Commission ruled that Mayo wasn't large enough geographically to warrant two full-time electorate offices but we have sourced sufficient funds within our budget to fund a permanent satellite office three days a week.

"I'd like to thank the Alexandrina Council and the City of Victor Harbor for providing space for my team within

their facilities for at least a day a week before the by-election and, in the case of Victor Harbor, a day a week after the by-election.

"But now we have our own place clearly signposted and we are looking forward to becoming a fixture on the South Coast.

"It was a low-key opening on 10 December as Christmas was close but I hope to host a celebratory sausage sizzle for the community in late January.

"In the meantime, I look forward to scheduling regular visits to the South Coast office around my Federal Parliament commitments in Canberra and work across the electorate."

Yankalilla District Community

Thank you to the residents and ratepayers who met me at Normanville and Yankalilla during December. Listening to your concerns helps me to represent your interests at Council.

Some people may have tried to contact me by telephone. The phone had a fault that was hard to rectify. It is now working.

Some residents have asked me to interact on the Council Facebook site, or on other social media platforms. In this letter to you I am going to explain my position on this.

When Facebook started several people contacted me and asked me to join - saying, It's easy, all you have to do is put up a profile. My response then was - I don't have a profile. Certainly not one that can be 'sent out' to an unknown (or known) audience and stay fixed as if that's me. I chose then not to get involved, and nothing I have seen about the way these communication technologies have 'developed' since then has persuaded me to become part of their practices. I have chosen to be a 'watcher' and analyst from the outside, to keep asking, what is going on here?

My analysis is that these technologies have altered culture, society and community in ways I do not support. Communication between people that used to be free, or be supported by services for a low cost, has now become commercialised and expensive and the revenue creates enormous wealth for a few.

The systems have hidden 'algorithms' that are being used to distort behaviour at the individual and cultural level. Users are now under surveillance in ways that are not known to them. Instead of following the protocols of face-to-face communication, people can now imagine they are actors on an imaginary stage, sending information out to a wide, unknown audience. This has shifted communication into a performance, rather than mutual interaction, often without passing through filters that were previously in place.

So many people are now spending so much time looking at screens, they are not paying attention to the land, rivers and seas to understand the devastation to the earth happening before them. Flicking a 'like' on an 'ecology' site is an illusion and delusion in effecting real change. I understand these systems can be used for effective purposes. But the impacts for me are more negative than positive, and for that reason, I am staying 'outside'. I welcome your response to this.

Upcoming Consultation

Willson Drive, Martin Road and Jervois Road – Road Network

An engineering report on the road network at Willson Drive, Martin Road and Jervois Road has recently been made available. Council invite the Community to one of two public meetings to discuss the report and the road network.

These meetings will be held at the District Council of Yankalilla, 1 Charles Street, Yankalilla on Friday 1 February 2019, at either 1.00pm or 6.30pm.

Proposed transfer of Council owned Sewerage and Water Assets to SA Water

Council and SA Water have been working on a proposal for SA Water to take on ongoing responsibility of the drinking water supply network in Wirrina, and our entire sewerage network.

Council and SA Water received feedback from the Community in 2018 that required additional investigation to determine what the overall effect of the change would have on the Council and the Community and the pros and cons of the proposal.

Council have now completed those investigations and invite you to one of two public meetings to present the results of the investigation prior to Council being presented a report at a March meeting of Council for consideration of a final decision.

These meetings will be held at the District Council of Yankalilla, 1 Charles Street, Yankalilla on Friday 15 February 2019, at either 1.30pm or 6.30pm.

Normanville Foreshore: Additional seating area

Based on feedback from the Community, Council has been working closely with the Normanville Kiosk leaseholder to provide additional outdoor seating area for all beach goers on the Normanville Foreshore. We hope you enjoy the enhancements made to the area.

Normanville Beach: Swimming Pontoon

Council in the adoption of the 2018/19 budget allocated funding to the installation of a Swimming Pontoon at Normanville. It had been planned to have it in the water at the start of summer, however we delayed the install to provide additional enhancements to the infrastructure to ensure upmost safety concerns were met. It is hoped by the time this is printed that you are reading this while sitting on the pontoon.

Cape Jervis Port: Infrastructure and Shared Zone

Council is continuing to work with Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) and Kangaroo Island Council on the Cape Jervis Port area. Council currently has care and control from DPTI over the boat ramp and finger infrastructure on a month to month basis and is working with DPTI on the improvements required to the infrastructure and on maintaining arrangements in the shared area beyond the boat ramp. The area is to be equally shared by all boat users, including the new ferry operator with the DPTI issued licence. Council has confirmed with DPTI that no boat is to receive priority access in this area.

All-Terrain Mobility Chairs arrive at Normanville Beach

People with mobility limitations will be able to get onto Normanville Beach this summer using the new all-terrain mobility chairs purchased by Council. The chairs were handed over to the Normanville Surf Life Saving Club for their care and control at a gathering at Normanville Beach in December. An adult chair and a child chair will be available to anyone who has a disability or reduced mobility wanting to enjoy Normanville Beach.

Rocky the Hooded Plover

Dedicated local hooded plover volunteers have helped a chick named 'Rocky' to fledgling stage, making it the first chick on the Fleurieu Coast in three years to reach an age that it can fly successfully.

Rocky hatched at the end of October at Shelly Beach at the end of Little Gorge, Lady Bay. Volunteers assisted roping off the nest and installing temporary signs to inform the public of the Hooded Plovers on the beach. The rope fence allows for a safe area for the birds to retreat to.

Hooded Plovers nest from August through to March on the beach above the high tide mark or in the sand dunes, so keep an eye out for them on the beaches over summer.

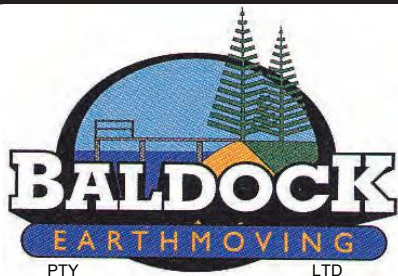

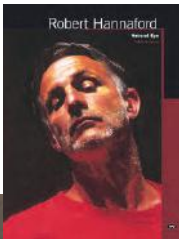

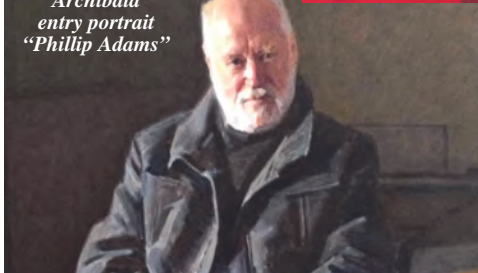

We have been using steel droppers and have found it extremely heavy carrying 16 droppers down each time we fence a nest – so thanks everyone you have made Hooded Plover monitoring much easier.



Hooded Plover Success

After 3 years we have had our first Hooded Plover fledge on a beach between Myponga and Land's End. We are all extremely excited about this success and hope there will be more to follow. Nick named Rocky, as the chick was always hiding amongst the rocks at the south end of Shelley Beach, he has already left his parents and gone on his own adventure. We would like to thank the

A Hooded Plover that fledged from Land's End in 2016 has been sighted on a beach on Kangaroo Island. She nested a couple of months ago and now has 2 chicks, they were due to fledge on Christmas day. We hope they had a successful Christmas fledge!!

Balloons

Balloons are a beautiful, colourful, fun-filled addition, used in so many cultural celebrations. But in the animal world these balloons often lead to some nasty life-threatening injuries and maybe death.

Once we let go of the string, the balloons float away in some magical display as we walk away and carry on with our lives.

The horrible truth is that they don't keep that magical appearance once they fall to earth, landing on beaches, in our oceans and other bodies of water. And with the increased use of balloons, comes the increased impact on the environment. This is when our marine and bird life mistake them for food or become entangled in the attached ribbon on the balloon.

When your balloon falls to earth and washes into the sea, it takes on the appearance of jellyfish floating in the ocean. As tides push the balloons around the coast, they attract turtles that mistake them for one of their favourite food sources, jellyfish.

Birds will often try to swallow balloons, thinking that they are fish or marine scraps. Once they are swallowed, they can block the airway or digestive tract, leaving the animal with no way of dislodging the obstruction or getting real food into their stomachs.

The ribbons can also get tangled around limbs and cut into the creature's flesh. If they are lucky, they may be found and saved before too much damage is done, but sadly many do not get help before it is too



late.

Balloons can be killers – You can help by sharing this information, pick up any rubbish from our beaches (3 orange balloons were found on Normanville beach just before Christmas) and waterways and drop into the Resource Centre to see what alternatives there are to decorate your next party!

Precious Plastic

Precious Plastic Fleurieu coast is a community driven project to collect waste plastics and to return them to the community as a valuable resource. This is done using the open source Precious Plastic plans which provide the information and plans to construct a plastic shredder, plastic extruder and a compression plastic recycling open source.

The objective of Precious Plastic Fleurieu Coast is to enable the community to assume responsibility for its plastic waste and to turn it into a precious resource and to add value to the plastic to keep it out of landfill and the ocean. The plastic recycling workspace, built by members of the community, can reduce waste plastic by up to 90%. An example of how this project can help our community is the production of star droppers manufactured from local waste plastic for the Normanville Natural Resource Centre's Hooded Plover breeding protection program.

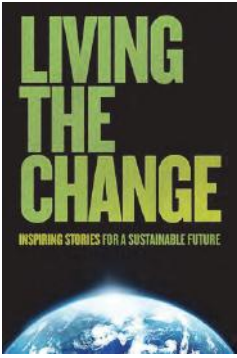

Weed of the Month

Salty Ice Plant

(*Mesembryanthemum crystallinum*)

We have featured this weed before, but a recent posting of its picture on SA Natureteers with a request for identification prompted us to revisit it. The response to the posting from many readers was immediate: GET RID OF IT! The Diggers Club states this plant "may naturalise in coastal areas" and "Not for SA"...and anyone who wanders around Cape Jervis over winter-summer can see why! This annual herb is a prostrate succulent, about 10cm high. Its leaves are covered in large glistening lumps, or bladder cells of water, giving the plant its common name. The plant grows rapidly over winter, but its growth slows in spring. Dry summers can kill the plants, but by then, its seeds have probably already been spread by rabbits (who eat them). Ice plants have several characteristics which make life hard for their neighbours: they can absorb a lot of moisture from the soil, outcompeting most other species; high levels of nitrate which build up under the plants can be harmful to other species; salt accumulates in the plant over its lifetime, and this is then released into the soil when the plant dies back in summer. Less salt-tolerant species suffer because of the salt which can inhibit both grown and germination of native species.

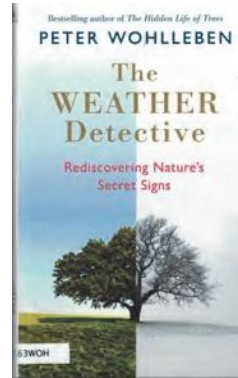

Travelling overseas, are your vaccinations up to date?

Dr Angela Knight is an experienced Travel doctor who will be able to provide you with the appropriate advice for your next holiday. It's important to get vaccinated at least 4 to 8 weeks before you travel, as this will give the vaccines time to start working, so you're protected while you're traveling. It will also allow you time to get vaccines that require more than 1 dose.

Which vaccines do I need before traveling?

This will depend on a few things, including:

- Where you plan to travel. Some countries require proof of vaccination for certain diseases, like yellow fever or polio. Traveling in developing countries and rural areas may bring you into contact with more diseases, which means you might need more vaccines before you visit.
- Your health. If you're pregnant or have an ongoing illness or weakened immune system, you may need additional vaccines.
- The vaccinations you've already had. It's important to be up to date on your routine vaccinations. While diseases like measles are rare in the United States, they are more common in other countries.

Healthy lunch box ideas

It is important to include a variety of food in your child's lunch box each day. These should include fruit and veg, dairy, meat (or meat alternative) and grains. Use fresh fruit if possible, using canned fruit in natural juice as a good alternative. Dried fruit can be included only occasionally, as it may cause dental problems due to high sugar content and can stick to teeth. Vegies in the lunch box are colorful and crunchy. They are great with dips or may be used grilled in rolls or sandwiches.

Children need dairy foods like milk, yoghurt and cheese for optimal growth and development. UHT milk is a handy alternative to regular milk when it is

unable to be kept cold. If your child cannot tolerate dairy foods, use alternatives like calcium-fortified soy or rice drink, or soy yoghurt. One serve of dairy is 250ml of milk, 200g of yoghurt (one small tub) or 40g of cheese (two slices).

Dairy ideas for the lunch box include:

- Cheese slices, cubes or sticks
- Yoghurt - natural or fruit. Try freezing a tub of yoghurt and putting it in the lunch box. By lunchtime, it will have partially thawed and be ready to eat. Remember to include a spoon.
- Milk - either cow's milk or calcium-enriched legume/bean/cereal milk products. In the summer, try freezing

milk overnight and wrap in a cloth for the lunch box to minimize the sweating. By lunchtime, it will be ready to drink.

- Include a food that is high in protein, such as some lean meat or poultry, fish, eggs, tofu, legumes/beans, or nuts and seeds. If your school has a nut-free policy, peanut butter and other nuts should not be included in your child's lunch box.

Cancer Data Highlights Importance Of Screening

Screened cancers such as breast, bowel and cervix remain among the most common cancers for both incidence and mortality in South Australia, according to the latest data from SA Health.

Professor Katina D'Onise, Director of Prevention and Population Health, said that participation in cancer screening was crucial in the early detection and possible prevention of cancer.

"Cancer unfortunately touches almost everybody in some way and we know from this data that one in three men, and one in four women in South Australia will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime," Professor D'Onise said.

"That's why we encourage everyone who is eligible to participate in screening programs for bowel, breast and cervix cancers as early detection is incredibly important.

"These tests have been developed

specifically to detect cancers well before any symptoms are present which is why screenings are so important even if you feel perfectly healthy. "Some cancers can be detected at an early stage, when treatment is likely to be more effective.

"As more and more people participate in screening, we can detect and begin treating cancers earlier and improve on current mortality rates." *The Cancer in South Australia 2015 Report* revealed there were 10,008 new cases of cancer diagnosed in South Australia that year.

For women, breast cancer was the most commonly diagnosed cancer in 2015, accounting for 29.4 per cent of cases while for men, prostate cancer accounted for 26.2 per cent of cases.

The report found that between 2011 and 2015 mortality rates for men decreased by 0.4 per cent per annum, while female rates have decreased by

Fight The Bite This Summer

South Australians are urged not to forget the mosquito repellent while they are on holidays, to prevent being bitten and the risk of mosquito-borne diseases.

SA Health's Acting Director of Health Protection, Michaela Hobby, said there is no cure and no vaccine for local mosquito-borne diseases, so the only way to protect yourself is to avoid being bitten.

"While mosquito numbers remain low in the upper sections of the River Murray, we are currently seeing high levels of mosquito activity in the Lower Lakes areas, particularly around Murray Bridge and the Coorong," Ms Hobby said.

"Last year there were 520 cases of the debilitating Ross River Virus, the most common mosquito-borne disease, and while numbers are lower this year at

54 cases, we shouldn't be complacent.

"Less common mosquito-borne diseases include West Nile Kunjin and Murray Valley Encephalitis (MVE) viruses which can cause permanent impaired neurological functions and, in some cases, death.

"The last major outbreak in South Australia of Ross River and Barmah Forest virus was during the summer of 2010-11, and also resulted in two locally acquired cases of MVE, of which one was fatal."

SA Health uses various measures to monitor mosquito disease prevalence, including routinely testing six flocks of sentinel chickens, located at strategic spots along the Murray River, for viruses spread by mosquitoes.

"Chickens are a good indicator of mosquito-borne disease risk to the community as they readily produce

antibodies to viruses which can also infect humans, yet they don't develop symptoms of those diseases," Ms Hobby said.

"We also work with local councils who have surveillance programs to monitor the types and numbers of mosquitoes within their areas.

"While our surveillance programs provide some information about the level of disease risk within the community, the only way of preventing mosquito-borne disease is to prevent getting bitten by mosquitoes, so we remind all South

Australians to take precautions and *Fight the Bite*.



"To protect against mosquito bites, people should wear long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing and use a repellent which contains DEET or picaridin. We also advise to eliminate potential breeding sites around the home."

Bush fires... a part of our past and a feature of our future

Before the advent of sophisticated fire-fighting equipment, out-of-control fires posed a serious problem for our early settlers. The oppressive heat in the summer, fires used for cooking continually left burning, and most building structures were made of flammable material including wooden planks and shingled roofs. Some earlier buildings were made from tree branches and thatched with grass, and seaweed was used for insulation. To add to the problem, there was no running water.

In February 1855 a new settler, living in a tent, carelessly lit a cooking fire in the open that escaped, causing one of the most destructive fires to date at that time in the Yankalilla district. The fire began on Cockatoo Flat and quickly spread to Mr Day's grass paddocks and then scrub, being fanned by a hot wind blowing that day. The fire rapidly burnt the whole of the area known as Yankalilla Bald Hills and encroached on the Hundred of Encounter Bay before it was stopped at Sheoak Hills through the energetic perseverance of the settlers near the head of the Inman River. Although the damage sustained was not as bad as had been anticipated, Mr Nosworthy, Mr Mayfield and Lieut. Lincoln were the worst affected.

Mr Nosworthy lost about 250 bushels of wheat, also about 200 acres of grass reserved for summer feed, as well as the fence enclosing it. Mr Mayfield's fences were destroyed along with several grass and stubble paddocks. He succeeded in saving his wheat stack but five valuable horses grazing in one of the stubble paddocks were severely injured and it was thought they would not survive. Lieut. Lincoln's house was saved but his garden was destroyed along with his wheat stack and fencing. Overall about 40 square miles had been ravaged.

A large fire occurred in 1906 and another in 1934. These fires burnt most of the bush from Silverton to Putland's Hill and Tunkalilla.

The Second Valley Forest Reserve, begun in 1912, was the second Woods and Forests Department planting in the Adelaide Hills/Fleurieu Peninsula region after Kuitpo in 1899. The Second Valley Government Forest became the highest-producing forest outside the south-east and contributed significantly to the state's economy.

The 1934 fire threatened the forest for three days and burnt 20 acres of pines. Apart from the homestead, sheds and stock in nearby yards, Tunkalilla Station was completely

burned including about 1000 sheep. Stan Martin and Maurice Bowyer attempted to drive the sheep still out on the pasture to places of safety and came close to losing their own lives. The wind changed from north to west causing the fire to burn within 10 miles of Victor Harbor before being brought under control.

The forest fire unit, initially horse-drawn, and later motorised, was the only fire unit in the area until the Emergency Fire Service was formed in the late 1940s. Manned by forest workmen, this unit assisted with the control of fires in the burning-off operations necessary to clear land for pasture development, and also assisted on most of the privately-owned properties which surround the forest.

Organised fire-fighting in Yankalilla began with Aub Pearson, Clerk of the Council; mechanics Murray Forrest, Noel Voit and Noel Lovelock; and Council Foreman Len Cockrum, who voluntarily overhauled the trailer unit fitted with an engine-driven pump and equipment which had been stationed at the hotel during the Second World War. Knapsacks and hand tools were issued by the Council and placed at strategic points throughout the district.

Yankalilla EFS later acquired a four-

wheel-drive ex-Army truck which was voluntarily reconditioned and equipped by mechanics from the local garages. In the early 1960s the Council decided to pay all maintenance on fire-fighting plant and equipment. This cost was subsidised 50 per cent by Government which also provided interest-free money to purchase plant. Two-way radio was introduced and the Bank of Adelaide local manager Jack Will was the base operator. A fire station was later built to house vehicles and equipment and the base radio operations.

Campers, beware of 'seedy' hitchhikers

Thinking about a New Year - Summer camping trip to the coast, the bush or along the Murray? Then keep an eye out for any spiky, 'illegal' hitchhikers who could be hiding in your gear.

Every summer Adelaide residents love escaping the city and setting up camp to enjoy relaxing at their favourite beach, bushland or riverside beauty spot. But most of us are completely unaware that in addition to family and friends, we risk taking along exotic weeds, one of the Australian bush's greatest enemies. Natural Resources Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges Regional Director Brenton Grear says it is easy for weed

seeds from home gardens or nature strips to get stuck on camping gear while the car is being packed.

"So if you live in the city, you can help protect the bush you love by taking a few simple steps," Mr Grear said.

"Check your gear carefully while you're packing it, and don't forget to check the soles of boots. Remove any seeds you find and put them in a bag before placing in the rubbish bin. Seeds can also lurk at the bottom of the storage boxes and bins commonly taken on camping trips.

"Also, remove any mud under trailers or the car which may also contain weed seeds.

"That way, you'll leave these unwanted hitchhikers behind and keep your favourite camping spots just the way you love them."

Mr Grear said Fountain Grass was one example of a problem pest plant easily transported from the city to the bush.

"Fountain Grass is a Declared weed found in many home gardens, suburban parks and roadsides. Because it produces large quantities of seed which germinate very easily, it's a particular danger to bushland and conservation parks, and poses a particular threat to the rangelands.

"The seeds are serrated and so they stick like glue to anything woven or webbed, including socks, boots, packs and swags. When we unpack our gear at camp, the seeds can become dislodged, fall to the ground and germinate then spread into the bush." Parks in the Adelaide and Mt Lofty Ranges region where camping is permitted all face weed invasion via this route. They include Onkaparinga River National Park, Para Wirra

Conservation Park, Deep Creek Conservation Park, and Newland Head Conservation Park.

The risk also extends to parks outside the AMLR region where Adelaide residents go camping, including those on Eyre and Yorke Peninsulas.
