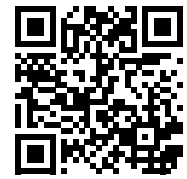

# A night of Christmas fun

Join us for a magical time under the stars when Civic Park Carols returns to Modbury's Civic Park on Sunday 14 December.

About 15,000 people are expected to come together to celebrate Christmas at this free community event hosted by the City of Tea Tree Gully.

The legendary Phil Burton from Human Nature will headline the show, alongside Santa and international TV stars Bluey and Bingo.

They will be joined by an impressive line-up of performers, including Darcy Callus, Philimon Araya, Oliver Sebastian, Michaela Burger, Katya Winspear, The Angeles, and Lucky Seven.

Backing them will be an 18-voice community choir and talented local musicians so you can sing along to your favourite Christmas songs.

Pre-show entertainment will get the crowd warmed up, with Choons and Moovz, The JAM Band and The Funny Farmers.

For those who want to watch from home, the event – including fireworks – will be livestreamed via Vimeo. Details on how to do this will be on our website from noon on the day of the event.

This year's charity partner is the Royal Flying Doctor Service, who will sell electronic candles to help light up the park.

# Raising the bar for local sport

**Local sport is on a winning streak, with Tea Tree Gully Council delivering \$25 million in fantastic new facilities and upgrades for four local sporting clubs.**

We thank the Government of South Australia for providing more than \$11 million in funding support for these projects.

Tea Tree Gully Gymsports now enjoys a purpose-built facility, complete with competition-level tournament space, a larger gym floor and bright, modern amenities.

Next door, the Tea Tree Gully Tennis Club has new headquarters, designed to support growing membership with quality spaces and an undercover grandstand.

At Ridgehaven, Modbury Sporting Club has moved into a new

facility, complete with unisex change rooms, umpire rooms and a function space. The facility is now set to boost community involvement in cricket and football.

Hope Valley Sporting Club is also gearing up for success, thanks to a new spectator shelter and seating, better parking and storage, plus new cricket training nets. This follows a major upgrade in 2021.

The Minister for Recreation and Sport, Rhiannon Pearce, said the projects were a win for the community.

*“These projects open up opportunities for people of all ages to get involved. When clubs thrive, communities thrive.”*

Mayor Marijka Ryan said the facilities were an investment in community wellbeing.

“These new spaces strengthen connections, encourage active lifestyles and support future generations of players and participants,” she said.

Tea Tree Gully Council has long focused on improving sporting facilities to meet high player demand, particularly females in sport. A recent community survey indicated that more residents are playing organised sports, which contributes to improved wellbeing.

Buildings are leased long-term by local sporting clubs. Everyone is welcome to drop in to buy a meal or book a space for their next event or celebration.

# Big plans for Elliston Reserve

**Highbury's Elliston Reserve could become one of the north-east's premier parks.**

Exciting plans are being drawn up to reinvent the reserve into a high-quality recreation park, thanks to \$150,000 in state government support for the project design.

Hundreds of trees and shrubs will be planted, while a new unique playspace, climbing wall, pump track and snake run for bikes, scooters and skateboards, picnic and barbecue facilities, public toilets and car parking are on the list for possible inclusion.

This is a major step forward for the space, which suffered the devastating loss of about 190 trees in 2023 due to the impact of giant pine scale – invasive insects that kill trees and pose a significant biosecurity threat to the \$3 billion SA forestry industry.

*“These plans are about working with the community to bring new life to the park after such a tough setback,” said Tea Tree Gully Mayor, Marijka Ryan.*

Design concepts will be considered by elected members, and community views will help shape the final designs.

External funding will be needed to bring the project to life. It is likely the project will be developed as funding becomes available.

For now, the reserve and its BMX track – which will be retained and upgraded – remain open for everyone to enjoy.

Elliston Reserve is owned by the state government and maintained by the City of Tea Tree Gully. It sits opposite the Hope Valley Reservoir. Sadly, thousands of pine trees were also removed there due to the presence of giant pine scale.

Giant pine scale attacks pine family trees, such as pines, firs and spruces. It leaves cotton-like secretions on the trunks and branches.

# Mulch to be thankful for

Thank you very much to everyone who comes along to our free Enviro Care green waste drop-off events.

You've helped make a real difference because all garden waste dropped off is processed into tonnes of mulch for local parks and reserves. In fact, last financial year, about 7,000 tonnes of green waste was turned into quality mulch.

This is not only great for the environment, it's helping save thousands of dollars annually as running these events and processing the mulch in-house is far cheaper than buying it.

Enviro Care events are held regularly throughout the year so residents can drop off excess green waste, such as leaves, lawn cuttings and branches up to 20cm thick.

Residents should bring ID and check there's no batteries or battery-operated items like solar lights or irrigation timers in their green waste.

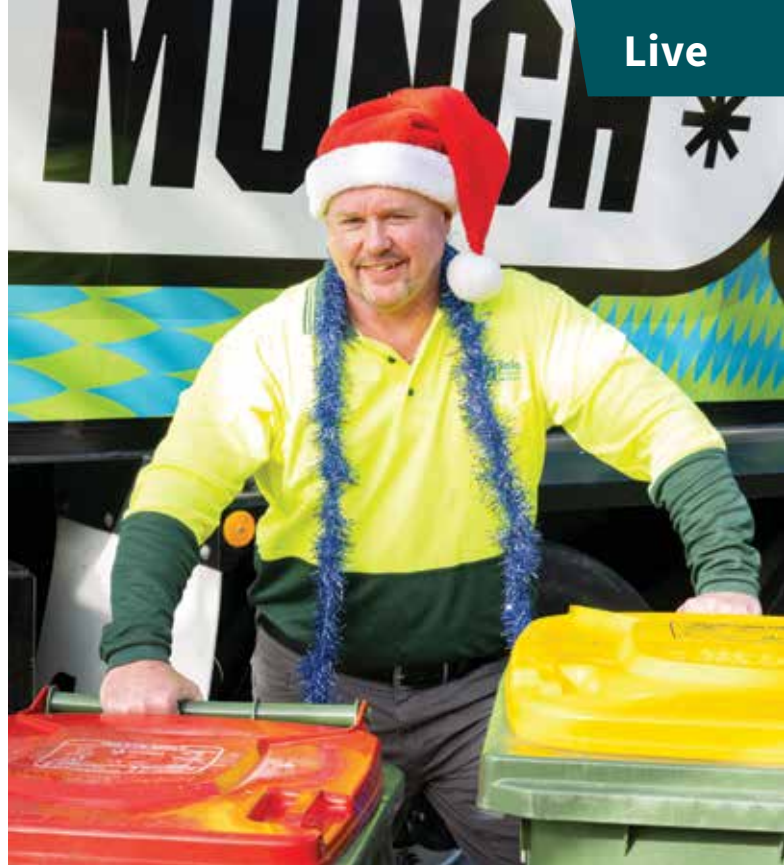

# Every step counts at Hallett Reserve

Take the first step towards a healthier, happier you at Hallett Reserve in Golden Grove, where every step really does count.

Tucked between The Stables Shopping Centre and the Harpers Field complex, the reserve features two short, flat nature walks: the Stables Circuit (about 920 steps) and the Ring Circuit (about 360 steps).

You'll find signs along the way showing your progress and step count, making it easy to work out just how far you've walked.

Do a loop before shopping, grab a coffee and go for a stroll, or take a walk while the kids play sport.

The new signs were funded by Preventive Health SA to encourage more people to enjoy the benefits of walking – from better fitness to improved mental wellbeing.

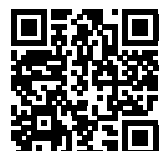

The Muddy Hands Festival was held on 4 October at the Golden Fields Reserve with approximately 6,000 people attending.

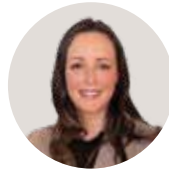
There was great feedback from the community, ensuring they enjoyed the day and are looking forward to the next one.

Giant pine scale continues to be a concern in our ward and has attracted a lot of media attention recently following notification of further infested tree removals at the reservoir.

Revegetation of Elliston Reserve is being planned with investigations, concept planning and high-level cost estimations progressing to prepare designs for this location. Community engagement is also anticipated to occur, once draft concept designs have been considered by Council.

The plan for the upgrade of Turramurra Recreation Centre is in the early stages, with Council considering options over the coming months. Turramurra is a popular sporting and recreation centre that hosts various basketball, netball and Strength for Life groups.

We are pleased to see the continuing beautification of Grand Junction Road with street trees and landscaping taking shape. A welcome upgrade to the area.
