

Ash Wednesday Remembered 40 Years On

Surf Coast Shire Council will host a community event to mark the 40th anniversary of the Ash Wednesday bushfires, providing a space for people to come together in memory and tribute.

Ash Wednesday Remembered – 40 Years On will also acknowledge the community spirit which provided a foundation for the region's recovery.

The event will be at Aireys Inlet Community Centre from noon to 2pm on 16 February 2023.

Ash Wednesday's inferno torched 41,000 hectares across the Otways

region, burning from Deans Marsh to Lorne on the wings of a ferocious northerly wind and then up the coast to Anglesea under the influence of an aggressive south-westerly change.

It claimed three lives, 729 homes, 53 other buildings, many livestock and many kilometres of fencing.

"Ash Wednesday left a black scar across a significant part of what we now know as the Surf Coast Shire," Councillor Gary Allen said.

"Given the magnitude of the event, and the abrupt way it changed so many lives, it is important that we acknowledge this significant anniversary.

"Our commemorative event is for people from across the shire. It will be an informal event that will include some presentations. We primarily aim to bring people together to remember and reflect.

"Though Ash Wednesday is now four decades distant, the memories can be terribly close. Support will be available for any people who might find themselves encountering uncomfortable memories or emotions."

Australia Day eliminated from Shire events calendar Heather Wellington (Councillor for Winchelsea Ward)

Surf Coast Shire Council has adopted its 'Awareness Raising Events Calendar' for 2023. With the community, Council will promote and celebrate twelve significant events over the year.

Some councillors have pursued the 'de-recognition' of Australia Day for some years. In 2021, Council dropped Australia Day from its events calendar. At its pre-Christmas meeting in 2022, Council voted to mark 26 January 2023 with Wadawurrung Traditional Owners on a Pilk Purriyn ('sunrise') day of reflection. Again, Australia Day is eliminated from the events calendar.

Many residents who have raised this issue with me acknowledge the hurt and sorrow many Indigenous Australians feel on 26 January each year. Some residents support a change of date for our national day. Almost universally, however, they want the Shire to celebrate contemporary Australia with the community on the date designated

by the Australian Government as our national day. Many described the Council's de-recognition of Australia Day as disappointingly divisive and beyond its mandate.

As a health care professional and humanitarian, I would like our national day to be celebrated on another date, when everyone can participate in a positive spirit. I also think the Australian Government must work much more effectively with indigenous Australians to address the enormous disadvantage many of them continue to suffer. Until the date of Australia Day changes, however, eliminating it from the Shire's events calendar is divisive and hurtful to many in the Surf Coast Community. It's wrong to try to address an existing problem by creating a new one.

The current Australian Government has the power to change the date of Australia Day but has explicitly rejected calls to do so and continues to encourage Councils to acknowledge its significance.

Councillors who support de-recognition of our national day claim the community supports their stance, but policy decisions such as these should not be made solely on the basis of majority views, Further, majority support cannot be claimed without evidence – yet there is none. Council's consultation has been limited to indigenous groups alone.

Despite Council's de-recognition of Australia Day, many indigenous and non-indigenous members of our community will continue to celebrate the day, with many no doubt also reflecting deeply on Australia's treatment of indigenous peoples and committing to a more just and united future. I intend to celebrate the day well and I hope that as I move around the Shire on 26 January I see many community members doing the same. I will be attending the Winchelsea Lions Club Australia Day breakfast and town get-together on the day.

Comments attributed to Surf Coast Shire Mayor Cr Liz Pattison:

"In September 2021, the Surf Coast Shire Council resolved to not formally take part in Australia Day celebrations, and to fly the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island flags at half-mast on 26 January.

We understand celebrating our nation is important to our community and that many community members will

celebrate on 26 January. Council's resolution does not seek to diminish the value of such a celebration, instead we believe our national day should be held on a different date.

First Nations Reconciliation is the first theme in our Council Plan, which is based on community feedback that this should be one of Council's key priorities.

Our path to Reconciliation will be long

and complex. We need to build trust through our words and actions. An important step in this path is acknowledging that 26 January is a difficult day for First Nations people.

Our goal in making a commitment to Reconciliation is to work toward shared understanding and mutual respect. Our view is that Reconciliation benefits us all and will make for a fairer and stronger community.

Changed flow conditions in the Barwon River West Branch

High flows in the upper Barwon River in winter, spring and early summer 2022, have eroded the Barwon River West branch in the Boundary Rd vicinity. This erosion has resulted in river flows breaking out of the main river channel and travelling down an old channel system on private property before re-joining the main channel approximately 6 km downstream. This change in flow has resulted in the low flow conditions in the main channel of the upper Barwon River West branch

In accordance with the Victorian Floodplain Management Strategy the Corangamite CMA manages works on large scale waterway erosion and has a role to limit the risk to public assets where the river has changed course.

The Corangamite CMA has commissioned consultants to investigate the changed flow conditions and determine appropriate short term and long-term remediation options. The Corangamite CMA will undertake emergency works as identified by the investigation to overcome the immediate issue before longer term works are undertaken.

With current conditions environmental water from the upper Barwon River entitlement will not be released down the Barwon River West branch to avoid

water entering the old channel system and causing flooding of private property downstream. Under normal conditions environmental water releases in the West Branch can be up to 30 ML/day.

On behalf of the Corangamite CMA, Barwon Water will be commencing release of environmental water down the Barwon River East branch soon, at 3-4 ML/day to avoid flooding private

Across the Barwon River system above Inverleigh, there has been rapid changes to river flow caused by the transition from wet to drier conditions, and if hot and dry conditions persist, past experience shows that the river is likely to cease to flow down to Inverleigh.

Supporting the health of the Anglesea River

The Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action together with the Corangamite Catchment Management Authority and Barwon Water are working to support the health of Anglesea River.

Our work will protect the environment, benefit local communities and ensure the river remains a popular destination for Victorians.

In recent weeks the level of the Anglesea River has dropped, creating a significant risk of activating acid sulfate soils at Coogoorah Park and releasing metals and acids into the river system.

While the River remains safe for water-based recreation, to prevent a significant impact on Anglesea's aquatic environment, DEECA (formerly DELWP) has requested Barwon Water to release stored water into the Anglesea River to reduce the risk of activating acid sulfate soils in Coogoorah Park.

While the stored water may contribute to increasing the acidity of the river, the risk of continued low water levels in the estuary is considered a greater risk due to its potential to activate additional areas of acid sulphate soils - a more significant and irreversible overall risk to the health of the Anglesea River.

DEECA has also worked with the Wadawurrung Traditional Owners Aboriginal Corporation, Great Ocean Road Coast and Parks Authority, and Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Victoria to minimise risks to native fish in the estuary.

The river is continuing to be monitored and if its pH or dissolved oxygen level reaches a trigger point harmful to fish, DEECA will request the Surf Coast Shire Council conduct an artificial estuary opening to allow fish to move and reduce the likelihood of a fish death event occurring. This action has not been taken before and will act as an important trial.

DEECA and Corangamite CMA may also coordinate manual fish rescue to remove fish if required.

Corangamite CMA will continue to monitor water quality conditions and seek opportunities to expand the monitoring network through Citizen Science programs.



- Continuing to help customers conserve water through the delivery of a number of

- water efficiency programs including leak detection and repair
- Continuing the delivery of our Customer Affordability Pipeline, which through efficiency, innovation and improved practices will have generated \$40 million of savings over five years, to ensure we can maintain the prices we committed to throughout 2018-23
- Implementing and planning for Renewable Organics Networks (RONs) for Colac and the broader G21 region to reduce organic waste to landfill, create renewable energy, generate jobs and drive economic growth through a circular economy
- Partnering with Barwon Health and GeelongPort on the Barwon Region Power Purchase Agreement from the Mount Gellibrand Windfarm, which means Barwon Water will meet its renewable energy use targets ahead of schedule
- Continuing to work collaboratively with our customers, community, stakeholders and industry through key projects including Water for our Future, the RONs, the Aqueduct
- Continuing to work proactively with community members, independent experts and stakeholders to remediate the confirmed impacts of historic groundwater management at Boundary Creek and Big Swamp.
- We also continued to progress the sale of surplus property under the Barwon Water Property Realisation Program to keep customer bills low.

COVID-19 Weekly Data

There were 4,912 COVID-19 cases reported in Victoria this week.

There are currently 324 COVID patients in Victorian hospitals. In the past three months, 6,019 COVID patients were hospitalised in Victoria

A total of 156 COVID-related deaths were reported to the Department in the past week. Of those deaths, 46.9 per cent were unvaccinated and 52.6 per cent had not received their third COVID vaccine dose.

The total number of reported COVIDrelated deaths in Victoria since the pandemic began is 6,794.

An increase in reported deaths was expected following recent periods of high transmission in the community. Transmission is being driven by multiple Omicron variants.

The risk of COVID infection can increase through large family and social gatherings. It is important to consider older family and friends and those who may be more vulnerable to severe COVID illness.

- Plan ahead this summer and consider the following tips to ensure you can enjoy the festivities safely.
- Plan your party or family gathering outside when possible
- Get tested if you have symptoms or you're going to a party or family gathering
- Keep homes well ventilated, with windows and doors open
- Wear a high-quality mask, especially where you can't physically distance from others

- Isolate for at least five days and until you have no symptoms
- Check if you are eligible for COVID medicines
- Get your next vaccine dose
- Protecting yourself is the best way to protect you and the community
 If you don't get COVID, you can't spread COVID
- Early testing for COVID and diagnosis are essential to access COVID medicines.
 For most COVID medicine to work best, you must take it within five days of getting sick – the earlier the better.
